# Top H.S. male athlete

GORMLEY — Five years ago, if anyone had told Paul Boynton he'd some day be selected Outstanding Male Athlete of Stouffville Dist. Secondary School, he'd have paid the prediction no heed.

He knows it now, having received the coveted award at a year-end ceremony. Principal Michael Muir made the presentation.

In his pre-teen years, Paul suffered from asthma, an illness that restricted his involvement in sports.

However, by Grade 10, his health had shown a marked improvement and with that came an intense desire to participate "in anything that came my way".

Initially, a hockey player, he turned from that to volleyball, a sport that was soon to become his "first love". Often he would arrive at school an hour early to get in some extra practice.

"It was Ken Benson who suggested I give it a try; he helped me a lot," Paul recalls. Assistance also came from Phys. Ed. instructor Jim Rehill. "He gave me encouragement," Paul's confidence in Mr. Rehill is such that he claims any high school in York County could produce a volleyball champion with him as coach.

In 1980-81, the team participated in 108 games. They've won the York County Title eleven years in a row. Paul describes S.D.S.S. as "a volleyball school".

The "Athlete of '81" has other sports interests as well. These include fastball, rugger, basketball, track and

field, the list goes on and on. This fall, Paul plans to enroll in a tool and die course at Seneca College. There, he hopes to "join forces" with team mate Steve Johns, an athlete he admires. "It was always a challenge to try and stay ahead of him," he admits.

Paul has high praise also for Gyl Langley, the high school's Outstanding Female Athlete. "I considered it an honor to be placed at her level," he said. Both Gyl and Paul attended an Athletic Leadership Conference at Lake Couchiching. They were students in Grade 11 at the time.

Paul has served as sports director at the Gormley Missionary Church and is currently a first-string pitcher with their fastball team.

Looking back, he sums up his athletic achievements at S.D.S.S. in these words: "I learned more about life through sports than I ever did through books — I met people there, I'll never forget".

Neither is Stouffville High soon to forget Paul Boynton.
