

# Much to do at Markham Fair

**MARKHAM** — What's new at this year's Markham Fair? Plenty, says President Dennis Seelye. The theme for 1981 is "A Fair To Come Home To". States

Dennis: Markham Fair is a meeting place, a time to renew friendships, recall memories and renew your roots. "Through the years, Markham Fair has maintained a 'something for everyone approach', and this year will be no exception," said President Seelye.

The most notable change in the 1981 program is that it will be longer. For the first time, the Fair will start at 6 p.m., Wed., Sept. 30 and continue through to 6 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 4. Some of the feature events each day follow:  
**WEDNESDAY,**

**SEPT. 30**  
 Getting things off to a fast start will be the "Hellriders", a free-wheeling thrill show guaranteed to keep fairgoers on the edge of their seats. This is a first-time event for Markham. It begins at 7 p.m. There's a Pony Pull in the Livestock

Building at eight. This feature may be delayed a few minutes so that spectators have the opportunity to attend both.  
**THURSDAY, OCT. 1**  
 For the fourth consecutive year, the Fair will feature Quarter Horse racing under the lights at 7:30 p.m. There will be pari-mutuel betting with a full field of entries through nine heats. There's a special track available for this attraction.  
**FRIDAY, OCT. 2**  
 Friday is Kids' Day at Markham Fair. In past years, up to 100 school buses from Metro Toronto, all loaded to the doors with children, have travelled to the Fair. More recently, a P.D. Day has been declared in the immediate area, allowing children from local schools to attend. Attractions throughout the day will be geared to the education and entertainment of school-aged boys and girls. Other features will include the Heavy Horse Show; a Country and Western Music Show and the Tractor Pull.

**SATURDAY, OCT. 3**  
 Saturday is considered the "Really Big Day" at Markham Fair. In recognition of the Fair's past history and the name of its sponsoring body "The Markham and East York Agricultural Society" the day has been designated as East York Day. Many activities will relate to this theme. The mayor of East York, Allan Redway along with President Seelye and other celebrities, will take part in special ceremonies. The program will be held on the race track in front of the stands around 12 noon. The trotters and pacers take to the track at 1:30. Quarter Horse Racing will resume at 7:30 and the annual Horse Pull in the Livestock Building starts at eight.  
**SUNDAY, OCT. 4**  
 A main event on the

Sunday is the Western Horse Show beginning at 11 a.m. This will be held at the front of the track and easily seen from the stands. The popular Conklin Midway will be featured all four days along with contests and entertainment. Booths on the grounds will be operated by area service clubs including the Lions, Kiwanis and Rotary. Church groups will also be acquiring space on the grounds. There will be a host of exhibits and displays in the Commercial Exhibits Building, the

General Exhibits Building, the Homecraft Building, the Poultry and Pet Building, Old MacDonald's Farm and the Livestock Building. The directors and committees have put together, what they feel is "the best show in town". As President Dennis Seelye describes it: "I feel Markham Fair is the best value for your entertainment dollar anywhere". Admission is \$2 adults; \$1 senior citizens; \$0 for children on Wednesday night, Thursday and Friday; \$1 on Saturday and \$2 on Sunday.

## Seneca College programs

# Pilot project here

**STOUFFVILLE**—A pilot project for Continuing Education has been launched in Stouffville through Seneca College. With several credit and general interest courses starting in the fall the project will run for one year.

The regular courses for adults 19 years of age and over start the week of September 21. These will all be evening classes held at the High School. Most will run one night a week from 7-10 p.m.

Other Seneca College courses include: Buying or Selling your home; Income Tax for the Self-Employed; Word Processing Concepts; Oral Communications; Health and the Family; and Exploring Career Alternatives.

will run depending on the interest shown. Each will require a minimum enrollment depending on the cost of operation. In January, all the first level courses will be repeated as well as second level corresponding with the fall term.

"If we get enough response (enrollment) the program will be set up on a permanent basis," said Gayle Atkinson, co-ordinator, for Stouffville. The project actually started this summer with several sports and crafts courses being offered to children. These included swimming, baseball, tennis, films at the library, and a feature outing at the end of each two week course.

"The idea of the project is that people won't have to go all the way into Toronto to take college courses," said Gayle. "It's really up to Stouffville whether or not the project works," she said. "A similar program has been running in Markham and is doing quite well." Credit courses being offered this fall include: Introduction to Psychology for Early Childhood Education students; Business Law I; Introductory Accounting I; Introduction to Pitman Shorterhand; and Advanced typing.

There are also several general interest courses being offered. These include: Sewing workshops, Cultural evening, Dungeons and Dragons, Recreational Program for physically handicapped children, Comparative Religions, Learning to play, Advanced Photography, Model making and crafts, Stretch sewing-knit fabrics, and History of Rock and Roll, a music course for young adults.

"I am trying to hire the instructors from within this area," said Gayle, "but where I can't I'll go outside. I'll also speak to anyone who's interested in instructing or setting up a course," she said. Office hours at the Information Centre are from 9-5 daily, but during registration will extend to 7 p.m. A special registration night is being held at the High School Sept. 17 from 6:30-8 p.m.
