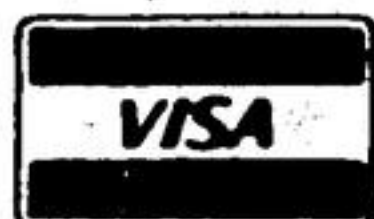

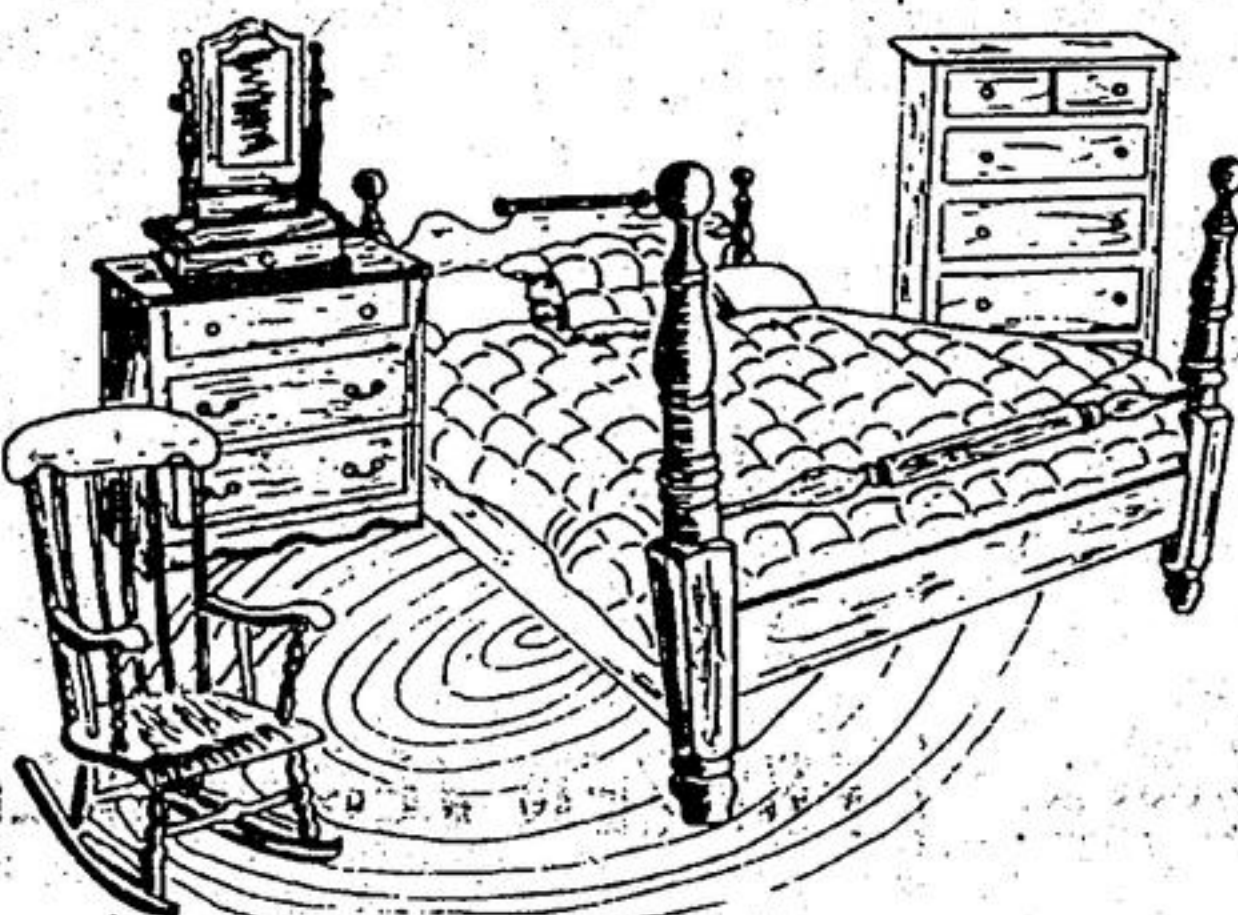
personnel from surrounding areas who gave of their time to make our Fair run smoothly. Markham Fair is a 'tradition' in this town, area and
