'Hit' with players

STOUFFVILLE — Marsha Clapp, Albert Street North, Stouffville, has stashed away her shinguards, spikes and mask. Softball's over for another season and so are her duties back of the plate. Marsha's an OASA umpire, one of only two ladies in the area holding such an important post. The other's Lynn Catherwood.

Once considered a man's world, the adjustment for Marsha (and participating teams) has been relatively easy. They respect each other.

"On occasions they question my calls (after all I'm still a rookie),

but I never change my mind," she told The Tribune. Nor does she intentionally 'even up'.

What keeps Marsha in command is the authority she shows in calling out the balls and strikes. The pitcher, catcher and batter know and so do the fans. The same goes for plays at the plate. It's 'yer out' or 'yer safe', no hesitation.

The North York Phys. Ed. teacher has yet to give 'the old heave-ho' to anyone. "A few have come close," she admits.

Marsha denies that players would ever try to take advantage of her because she's a girl, at

least there's been no indication of this to date, she says. As for the gender of games she handles, it doesn't matter. "I enjoy it too much to care," she claims.

Marsha does have a preference as to positions. She'll take the plate every time if given the choice. "It's really the easiest," she says, "there are more close calls on the bases".

Regardless, she always uses a counter to keep track of balls and strikes. But she never keeps tab on the score.

Normally, one doesn't think of a softball doing anything 'funny' on the way to the

plate. Dips and dives are more often associated with baseball. Not so, says Marsha, curve and rise balls are common—and very deceiving.

While the pocket money's appreciated, the equipment required is costly—as much as one hundred dollars excluding spikes. However, the investment, if properly cared for, should last a lifetime.

After this season, Marsha now knows the game from two sides of the plate—as a player and an official. She appreciates the skills required of both.

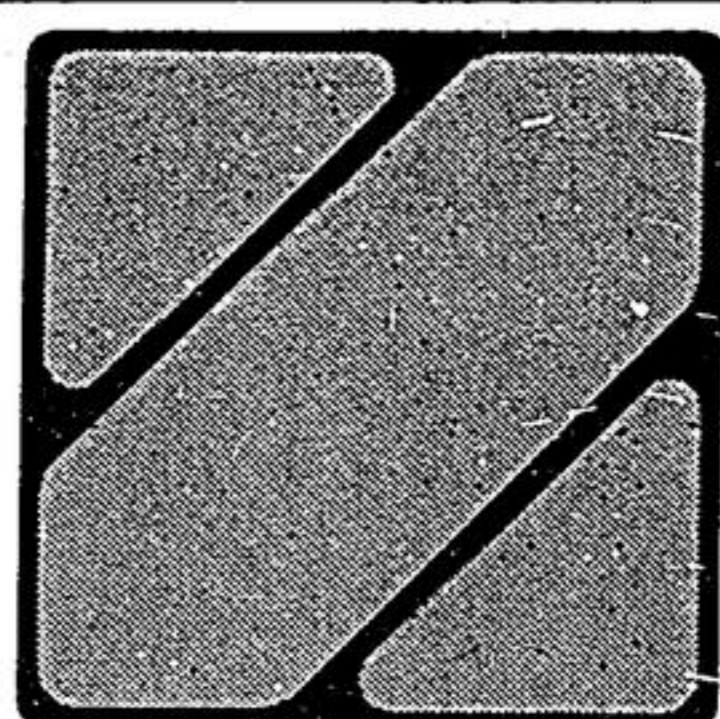
