A public meeting will be held by the Planning Committee of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, as noted above, to present and discuss the following proposed Official Plan Amendment:

Amendment No. 4 to the Official Plan of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville planning area which introduces a new land use designation entitled "SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL" and related policies, and changes the land use designation from Rural, Industrial and Major Open Space to "SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL," "ESTATE RESIDENTIAL," "INDUSTRIAL" and "MAJOR OPEN SPACE" on part of LOTS 1 & 2, CONCESSION 10.

Generally, a "SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL" designation will permit a "single family detached dwelling" residential development serviced by municipal water and private waste disposal systems on an average density of 6 people per acre.

The subject site, comprising approximately 115 acres, is located in LOTS 1 & 2, CONCESSION 10 and has frontages on the east side of HIGHWAY NO. 47, the north side of MAIN STREET EAST and the west side of the YORK/DURHAM LINE.

The Amendment results from an application proposing 62 Suburban Residential lots, 4 Estate Residential lots and a 6 acre Industrial block.
