Each day they arrived at 9:30 a.m., and until 3:30 p.m., were pioneer pupils at old Dickson's Hill School. Their clothes, lunches, school supplies and work, were of the 1851 period. Each day they visited different people in the village - the blacksmith, weaver, cabinet-maker, innkeeper, broom-maker, clock-maker, seamstress, printer, storekeeper and more, to learn how their ancestors once lived. What a positive educational experience

each pupil enjoyed! Memories will linger on making brooms, planing a board to make "spills", weaving on a loom, petting the horses, grinding wheat, spelling bees, using slates, making cookies and bread, and going on a sleigh ride. A rag rug, made by the pupils, will hang at Orchard Park.

Our thanks to everyone responsible for this adventure. A special thank you to Mrs. Harris for all the planning, organization and teaching necessary to bring 1851 to life for each student.

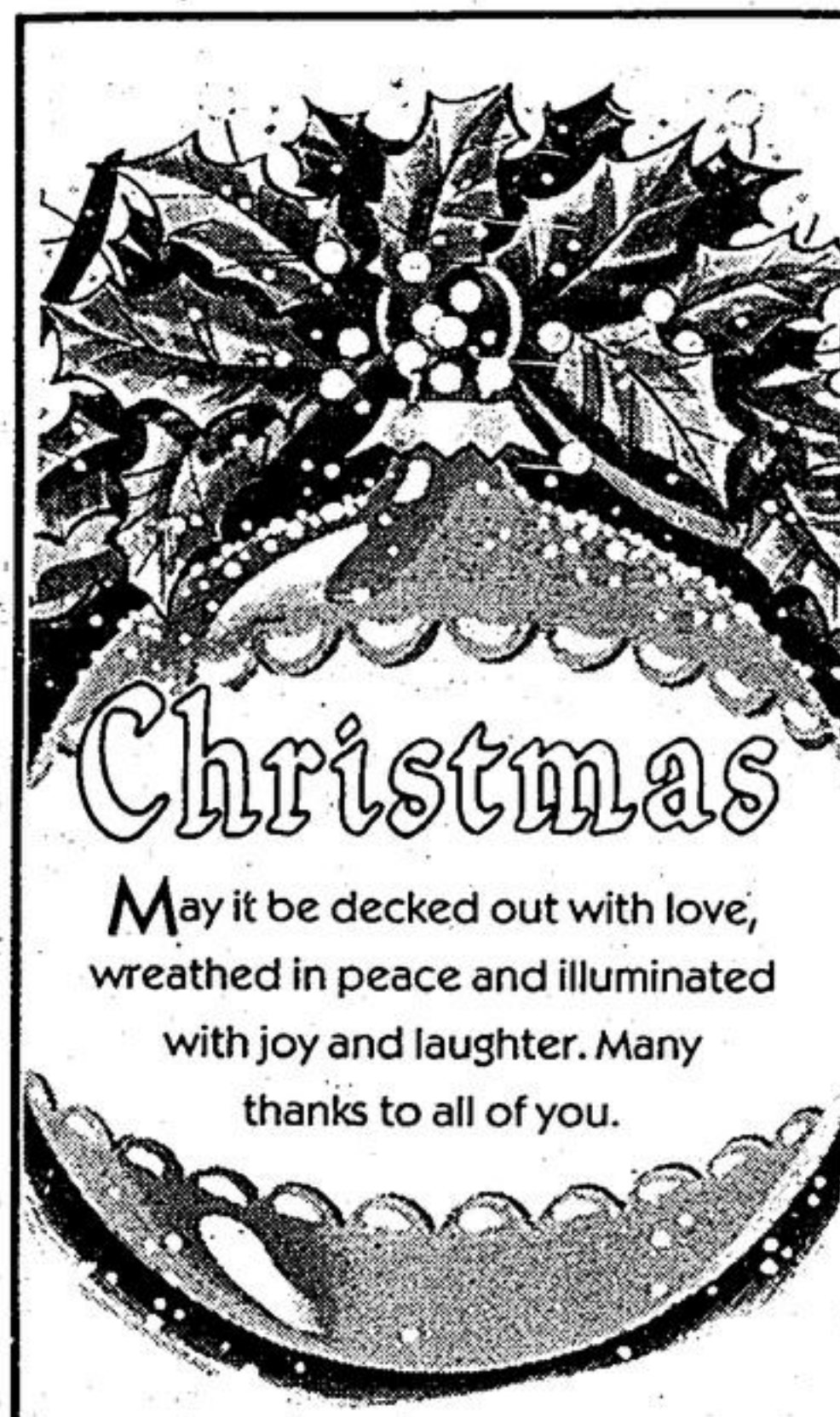

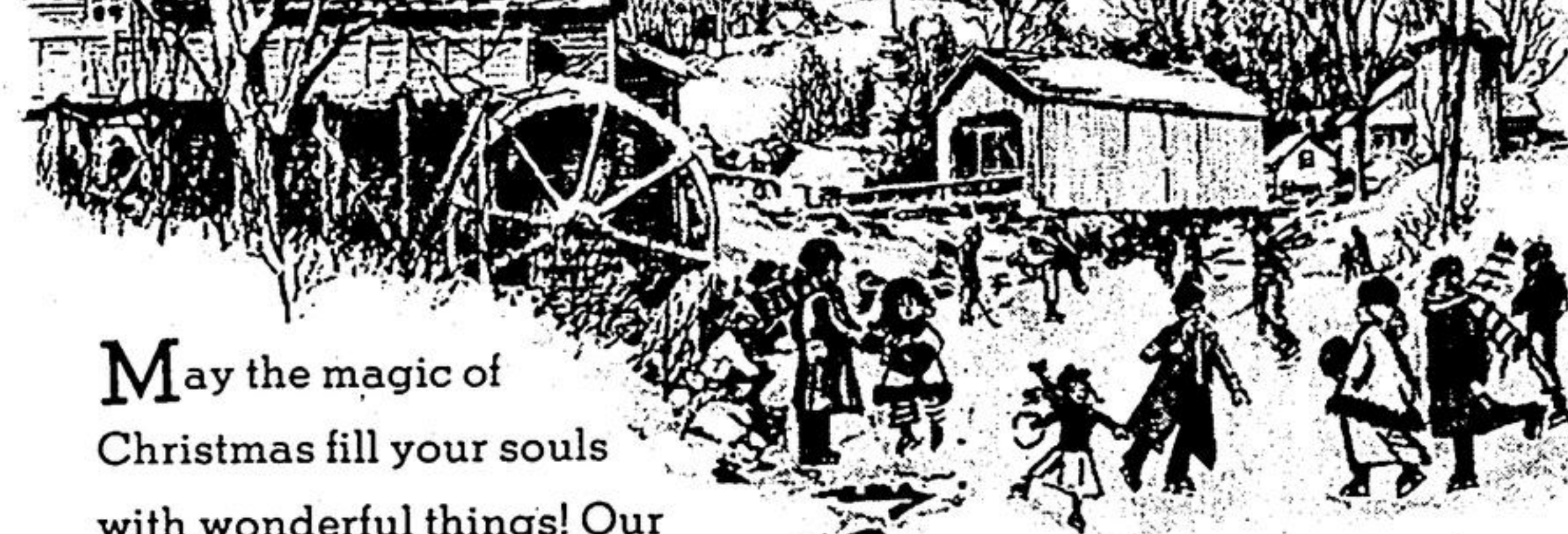
