Extend Via rail

STOUFFVILLE — Hopes that the VIA rail commuter service would not only not die, but even extend to Uxbridge, were expressed by the leader of a recent delegation to Council.

John Pike appeared on behalf of the A-Must Train Association, Stouffville Chapter, which is attempting to keep the VIA service from Toronto to Stouffville, in existence. Notice of intent to cancel was made earlier in the year by Federal Minister of Transport, Jean-Luc Pepin.

Pike, who was accompanied by three

other members of the Association, said the latter had been stressing a "low-key approach" to the matter in its attempts to get support in its fight, and it "seems to be paying off."

He said the group had been directing its efforts toward the provincial, rather than federal, government, because it didn't have "the time, financial or personnel resources to become entangled with a Federal Ministry which has stated from the outset that no exceptions will be made to their decision."

So far, York Centre MPP, Donald Cousens, had promised support, and a recent presentation had been made to James Snow, minister of transportation and communication.

"We left this meeting with a significant feeling of optimism, that the GO-Transit Train system will run not only to Stouffville, but through to Uxbridge," he said.

Pike said that "several thousand signatures" had been obtained from Stouffville residents, backing the cause, and petitions had been distributed throughout the stores.

When asked about the numbers regularly riding the daily train, Pike said there were "now 30 getting on at Stouffville, and today we had 39."

There were another 40 boarding at Markham; all told, 275 to 300 people used the train daily.

Pike asked council to "support the retention of train service, whether VIA, CN or GO."

"What we're really after is the retention of train service," he said.

Councillor Bill Kamps moved to support the request.

Mayor Eldred King said that council was "quite confident, it (the service) is going to be replaced by something, and would support any position for its continuance."

He said that Council had asked that it be allowed to participate in any discussions regarding VIA's future.

Councillor Wilf Morley said he was concerned about the real estate taken up by the train tracks in Stouffville.

The motion to support the request was carried.

Mailing of Assessment Notices

A 1981 Assessment Notice for 1982 property taxes has been mailed January 4, 1982 to every property owner and tenant.

An Information Insert mailed with your Assessment Notice explains the appeal procedure and provides the timetable for Open Houses in your area.

Open House Sessions will Answer Questions

Open House sessions have been planned at convenient times and locations in your municipality to afford you the opportunity to review your assessment with staff of the Regional Assessment Office.

Assessment staff will be pleased to explain the basis of your property assessment and are authorized to amend all data (school support, assessment, etc.) on your Notice.

You are encouraged to take advantage of this service.

New School Support Procedures

Beginning this year your school support designation will appear on your Assessment Notice. This designation indicates whether the education portion of your property

taxes will be directed to support public or separate schools.

If you wish to review your school support designation, contact your Regional Assessment Office or attend an Open House in your area.

Rolls Available For Review

The Assessment Roll will be available for review at your local Municipal Office during regular business hours beginning January 29, 1982.

If you wish to Appeal

If you believe you have been improperly assessed in any way, you may file a formal complaint with the Assessment Review Court. The final date for filing an appeal is February 19, 1982.

Information on appeal procedures is provided on the back of your Assessment Notice and Information Insert.
