Race champion

STOUFFVILLE — Larry Van Dyke of Bethesda, well known snowmobiler and Arctic Cat dealer, beat some of North America's top formula one sled racers at Peterborough over the weekend.

Driving a 340cc Arctic Cat Sno-pro, Larry took four firsts and a second in the round-robin eliminating heats, also the Kawartha Cup formula one title; beating out 26 top entries and picking up \$2,000 in prize money.

After several attempts to win the title, Larry did not find the task easy. In the five lap final he left it late before challenging Jeff Biddicombe of Spokane, Washington; also on a Cat. He passed Biddicombe on the last corner of the final lap to be first over the line.

Third place finisher was Garry Zessair of Honey Harbour, Ont., driving a Moto-ski, while another American, Tim Bender of Buffalo, came fourth on a Yamaha.

Credit for the machine's faultless performance must go to Larry's mechanics; Bill Rising of Barrie, Dave Haynes of Scarborough and Jim Saltys of Gormley.

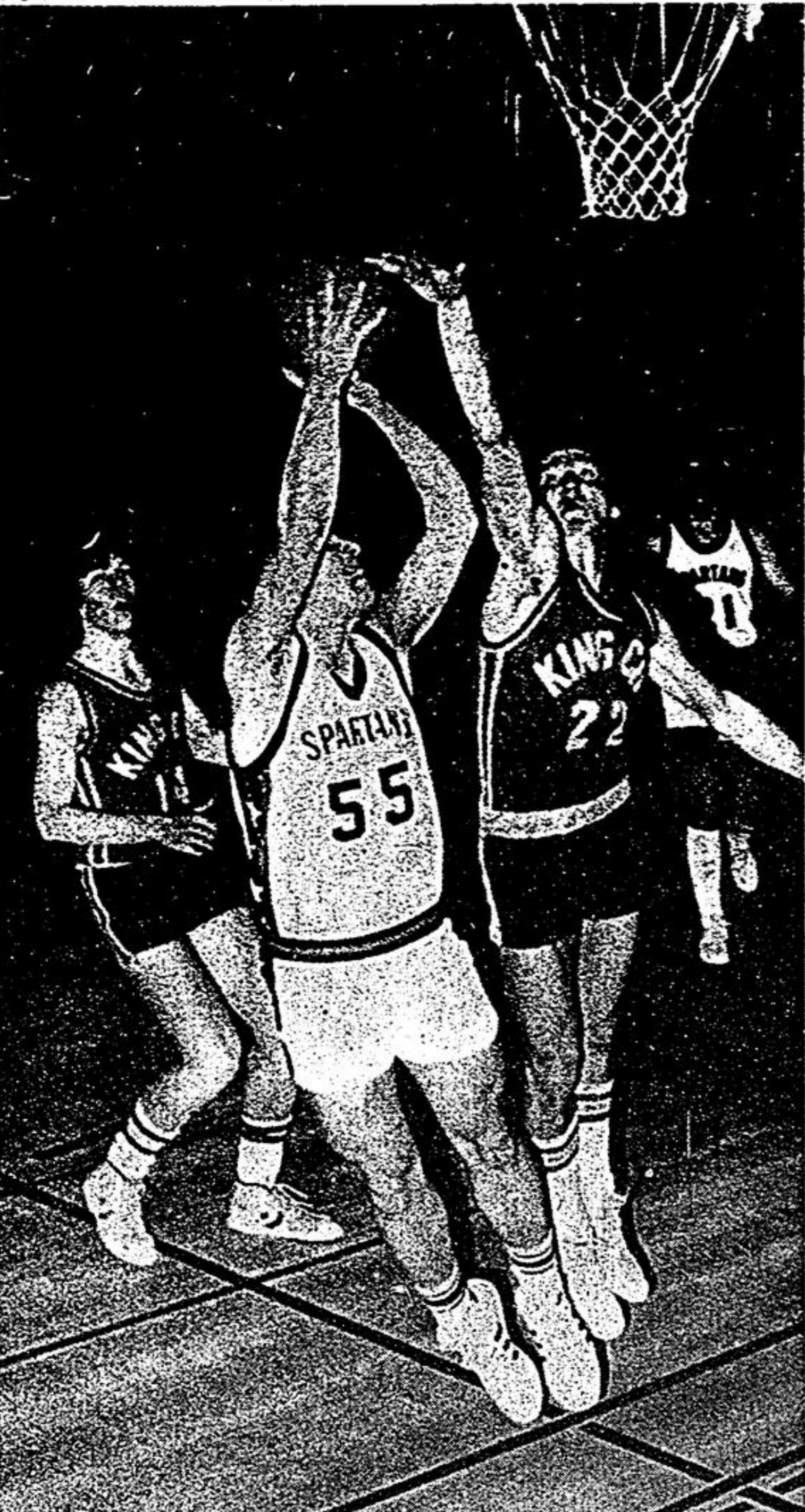
