

Radio Station CFRB will broadcast reports from traffic reporter Henry Shannon at the show. He also will be Master of Ceremonies at the Activity Centre.


Accessory Department will feature suppliers to dealers and the public, such as customizing, van conversion, audio specialties, sun roof installations.
