

Juveniles battle to stay in playoffs

Napanee prove tough

STOUFFVILLE — Compared to their previous playoff performances, the Juvenile hockey team came up flat in their first game of the third round series against Napanee on March 3.

A star performance by Stouffville netminder

Scott Lippett and a two goal tally by Garry Teggart failed to keep the fast skating Napanee team from edging their hosts 3-2. Teggart's opener at the ten minute mark brought no response from Napanee, but both teams matched goals in

the second period. Defensively, Lippett was left vulnerable as the Stouffville defence deserted him to foray deep in the Napanee end. Heavily screened on occasions, his saves were purely instinctive.

Both sides blew a

number of opportunities, Stouffville in particular. In the second and third periods, perfect passes to the front of the net were wasted because the offensive line failed to keep up with the puck.

Sunday's game saw a 4-4 tie at Napanee and another tie; this time 2-2, at Stouffville arena on Monday evening.

Monday night's game was a seesaw battle that could have gone either way and was forced into overtime, as was Sunday's game,

without resolving the issue. A scoreless first and third periods took nothing away from this exciting game. Both sides are so well balanced the rest of the series could well end up as ties.

Napanee opened the scoring with a power-play goal at the 11 minute mark, and gave it back six minutes later when their goalie, having killed the puck, let it slip through his glove. The shot came from Blair Purcell.

A shorthanded goal by Napanee put them up

2-1 at the 1:18 mark. Stouffville's reply came from Dave Carmichael on Howie Underwood's assist with only 17 seconds left in the frame.

With a win and two ties Napanee now lead the series 4-2 in points, out of a possible 6 needed to clinch the series.

Tonight, Wed. March 11, the Stouffville squad travel to Napanee to try and even the tally. If necessary, the final and fifth game in the series will be played at Stouffville on Saturday. Game time 7.30 p.m.

Unfortunately the win over Napanee was overshadowed by a bad injury suffered by the A's hard working right-winger, Mark Murphy, when he was given a hard check into the boards in the first period.
In the third game of the series at Stouffville on Sunday afternoon the A's sparkplug was again
