Separate School Board

Record budget

YORK REGION — Frank E. Kelly, Chairman of the York Roman Catholic Separate School Board, this week announced approval of a 1982 budget totalling \$35,458,609.

This record-setting budget reflects the Board's continued unparalleled growth. The effect on an average home assessed at \$30,000 will mean an increase of \$64.80 additional property taxes.

This increase combined with an expected increase in secondary school costs should leave the Board's supporters with an increase of 12.5 per cent, which is consistent with the current rate of inflation and cost-of-living index. To accomplish this target, the Board has made in excess of \$377,000 in budget cuts since the first draft of the budget was unveiled, in order to

maintain a competitive mill rate with the York Region public school board. Mr. Kelly said that this was an especially difficult budget year, as the Board is suffering through high interest rates, and high building costs, while still attempting to meet all the requirements necessary to keep the standard of education at the level that the Board's supporters have come to expect.

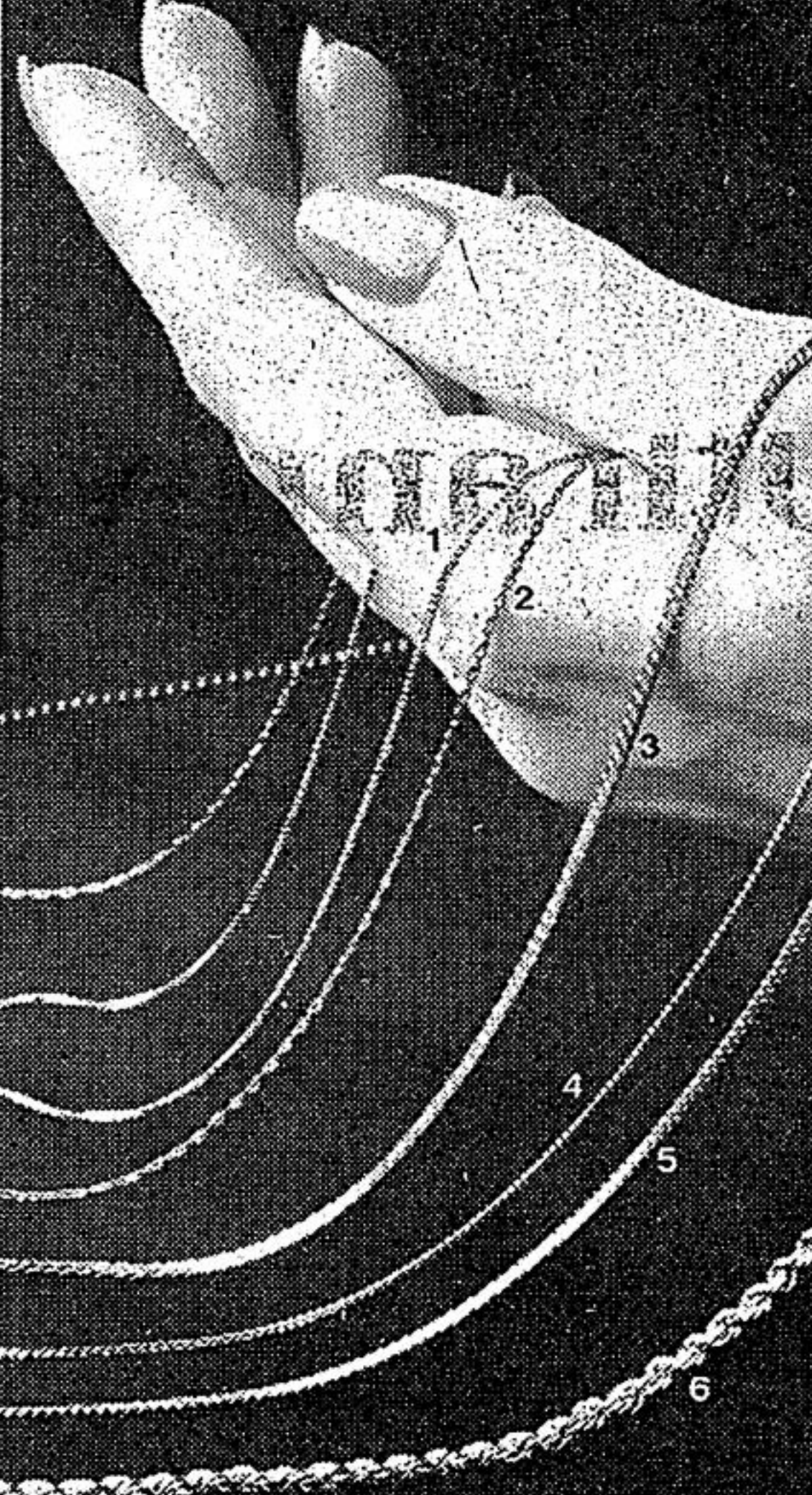

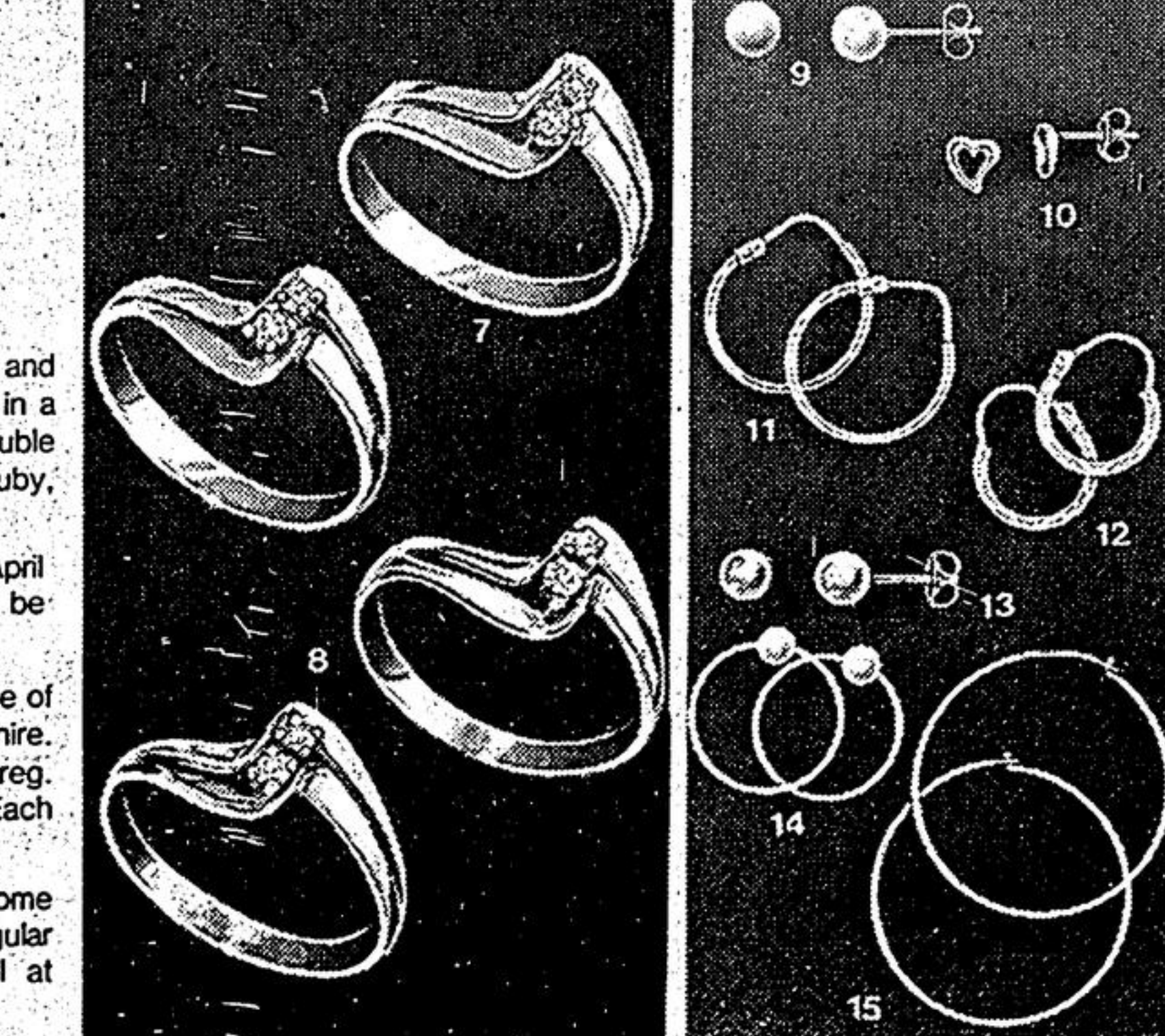
