STOUFFVILLE — A \$200,000 re-modelling and expansion project at Canadian Tire Corporation store, Main Street West, Stouffville, will include the installation of the town's first propane tank.

The company is also adding three more car repair bays to its auto service department.

A new garden centre to the east will open when weather permits, manager Frant Larmer told The Tribune.

Six staff mechanics will be enrolled in a course on converting gas engines to propane, Mr. Larmer said. The conversion cost ranges from \$1,200 to \$1,400. However, propane is about half the cost of regular gas.

Construction work at the site is expected to be completed by mid-April.
