Bright light idea

STOUFFVILLE — "Another first for Stouffville."

That's the way Ted Maude, president of Sharco Video Inc., Stouffville, describes "Lite Minder," an innovative article for car dashboards, that he and his wife, Sharon, have come up with.

The new invention, "suggested by my wife," is a tiny, question-mark shaped clip, which can be fastened on to a motorist's key while it's in the ignition, to remind him to turn off his lights when parking.

When not in use there, it can be hung on the car headlight switch. With the Lite Minder, however, it will be difficult, if not impossible for a motorist to be caught with his or her lights left on, says Maude.

He said, too, his company had a world-wide patent and registered trade-mark on the invention, and it would be on sale in two weeks. "It's kind of fun knowing you invented something and hold the world rights to it," he said.

STOUFFVILLE — Only seven voting members attended the Business Improvement Area meeting, March 17, at the Regal Restaurant, Stouffville. A 1982 budget of \$9,255.00 was approved.

More planters and benches will be added to the Main Street, with the cost placed at \$5,000.

There was some discussion concerning hanging baskets, similar to those on the Main Street of Markham. The cost is

estimated at \$45 each plus poles and brackets. Member Ron Berry promised to introduce the subject at a committee meeting of the Stouffville Lions and report back. Treasurer Paul Roney said he liked Markham's flag idea too "as long as it's not over-done".

Speaking briefly on landscaping plans for the entrance to the Town Library, Mr. Roney said he hoped whatever is done, will tie in with the business improvement program.
