

Ajax wins successful A.H.L. tournament

STOUFFVILLE — Ajax emerged unbeaten in the first Molson annual hockey tournament, staged by the Stouffville Amateur Hockey Club over the Easter weekend. They won the tournament title after downing Markham with an effortless 9-3 win.

Stouffville teams did not do well in the early rounds. Apart from Stouffville Travel and Village Pools, both of whom got into the championship division, the remainder were relegated to the consolation round.

Betz Pools, this season's playoff champs, disappeared from the scene after being doubled 4-2 by Markham and then getting edged 3-2 by Farquharson. Really For Farquharson it was a sweet revenge, Betz robbed them just a week earlier. The Realty boys went on to win the consolation title, dumping the May-Powell North Stars 3-1 in the process. However the 'Stars' proved themselves no pushovers. Ajax, the eventual champs, were hard pushed to edge

them 5-4 in the opening round of the tournament.

The strength of all the teams was apparent throughout the tournament. Ajax barely managed a double win over Scarborough, 6-5 and 4-3, before they met Markham.

Stouffville Travel downed Village Pools 4-1 in the championship round before being doubled 6-3 by Markham in the semi-finals; it was the best performance by a Stouffville team in that division.

The tournament was a resounding

success for the Amateur Hockey League. Throughout the two-day event not one game fell behind time, thanks to excellent scheduling by the convenors.

Surprisingly, considering the number of games played during the tournament, the ice remained in prime condition; thanks to Joe Lewis and his staff.
