### TOWNSHIP OF UXBRIDGE NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY NOXIOUS WEEDS

Under the provisions of the Weed Control Act the Province of Ontario, Public Notice is hereby given to all owners and occupants of subdivided lands within the Township of Uxbridge that unless the noxious weeds or seed on any such subdivided lands in the Township of Uxbridge are destroyed by Friday, June 4, 1982, and throughout the season, the Council of the Township of Uxbridge has directed the Weed Inspectors for the Region of Durham to cause said noxious weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such a manner as they may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspectors in the discharge of their duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Township of Uxbridge against the respective parcels concerned and that such amounts shall be collected in the same manner as taxes under the Municipal Act. The cooperation of all citizens is earnestly solicited.

General Information - Weed Control The following have been appointed Regional Weed Inspectors for 1982 with their areas of responsibility indicated:

R. Thompson - the north half of the Township of Uxbridge - 357-3368

K. McKnight - the south half of the Township of Uxbridge - 655-4776

Section 4 of the Weed Control Act states "Every person in possession of land shall destroy all noxious weeds thereon". Regional Weed Inspectors can issue orders to destroy noxious weeds, but they have no authority to order weeds to be destroyed that are not on the Noxious Weed List.

The schedule of weeds in the Regulation lists 23 species of plants as noxious weeds and they are as follows:

Bull thistle Canada thistle Common European Buckthorn Dodder Field bindweed Goat's-beard Johnson grass Milkweed Nodding thistle Poison ivy Ragweed Russian thistle Scotch thistle Sow-thistle, perennial, annual Spurge, cypress Spurge, leafy Tuberous vetchling Wild carrot Wild garlic Yellow rocket

Weeds such as Dandelions and Goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds under the Act.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

##### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

###### (a) Statement of Revenue and Expenditure

This statement reflects the revenues and expenditures of the revenue funds and the following local boards and municipal enterprises:

Public Library Board  
Community Recreation Centres  
Museum Board  
Arena Board  
Water Utility  
Stouffville Cemetery Board  
Business Improvement Area Board

###### (b) Statement of Capital Operations

This statement reflects the capital expenditure of the municipality to be recovered from the general municipal revenue of the municipality and its local boards and municipal enterprises as described in note 1(a).

###### (c) Balance Sheet

This statement reflects the assets and liabilities of the revenue fund, the capital fund, reserve funds and local boards and municipal enterprises as described in note 1(a).

###### (d) Fixed Assets

The historical cost and accumulated depreciation of fixed assets is not reported for municipal purposes. Instead, the "Capital outlay to be recovered in future years" which is the aggregate of the principal portion of unmatured long term liabilities, capital funds transferred to other organizations, and the cost of capital projects not yet permanently financed is reported on the Balance Sheet.

###### (e) Municipal Enterprises

Municipal enterprises are those activities whose costs are substantially recovered from service charges on the users. The enterprise of this municipality whose revenues and expenditures have not been consolidated in these financial statements is:

###### (f) Charges for net Long Term Liabilities

Debt retirement costs including principal and interest are charged against current revenues in the periods in which they are paid. Interest charges are not accrued for the periods from the date(s) of the latest interest payment(s) to the end of the financial year.

###### (g) Trust Funds

Trust Funds administered by the municipality amounting to \$107,120 are only reflected in the Trust Funds. Statement of Continuity and Balance Sheet.

##### 2. CAPITAL OUTLAY TO BE RECOVERED IN FUTURE YEARS

(a) Capital outlay to be recovered in future years not representing a burden on general municipal revenues, as it is to be recovered in future years from special charges on benefiting landowners is \$9,913 (1980 - \$11,212).

(b) Capital outlays, including fixed assets and the transfers of capital funds in the amount of \$133,711 which have been financed from general municipal revenues of the current year, are reported on the Statement of Revenue and Expenditure.

##### 3. RESERVE FUNDS

During the year, \$441,007 were credited directly to reserve funds without being recorded as revenues and expenditures of the Revenue Fund. Sources were:
