Their skills and ability will be tested to the full when they enter the York County finals later this month. Notwithstanding any injuries, the team has an excellent chance of going all the way this season.

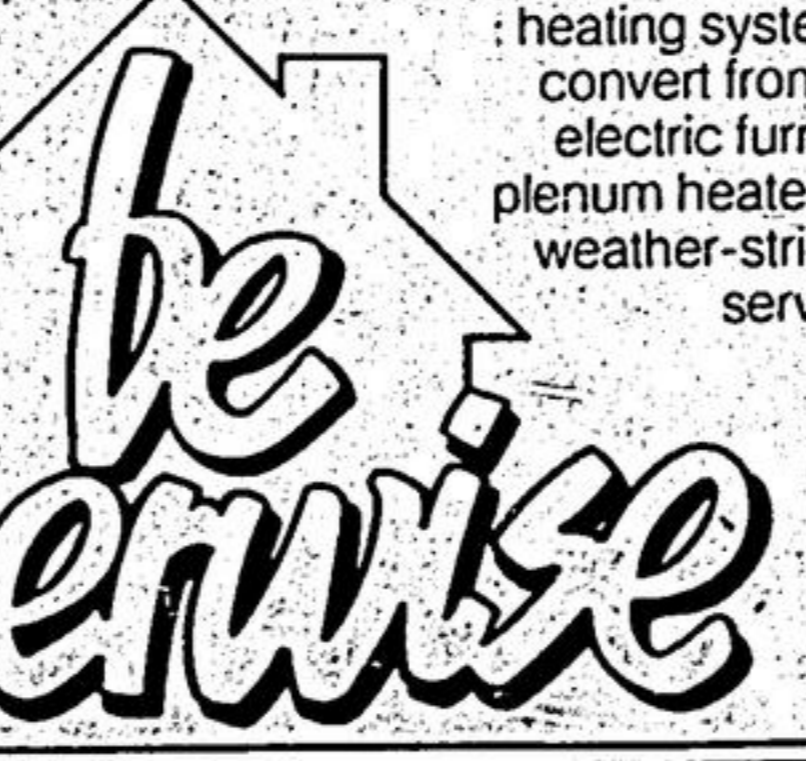
