# Honored on ninetieth birthday

**STOUFFVILLE** — Mrs. Susie Hutchinson was the centre of attention Saturday afternoon. The occasion was an open house at Springvale Baptist Church, a celebration to mark her 90th birthday. More than 120 relatives and friends attended.

Mrs. Hutchinson resides in the Sr. Citizens' Apartment on Elm Road in Stouffville and "loves it." "Every one there is very kind," she says.

Born on the 9th Concession of King Township near Schomberg, she attended Schomberg Public School. In March 1914, she moved to the Whitchurch-Stouffville area and, with the exception of a short time spent at Sundridge, has lived here ever since. Mr. Hutchinson died in 1942.

During Saturday's happy event, Mrs. Hutchinson was visited by three important personalities, M.P. Sinclair

Stevens, M.P.P. Bill Hodgson and Town Mayor Eldred King.

Mrs. Hutchinson is proud of her family that includes two sons, Keith of R.R. 2, Stouffville; Andrew in Sundridge; one daughter, Eida (Mrs. Walter Brown), also of Sundridge; 13 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Hutchinson was lovely for the occasion, her mauve dress accentuated by a beautiful mauve corsage. She talked and laughed with visitors as they filed in many from a distance.

She readily admits that Springvale is like a "second home." She's attended service there regularly for close to 70 years. When it comes to transportation, she need look no further than Floyd Ratcliff or Charlie Clubine, and if they're not available, son Keith is close at hand.
