# Share concerns

**STOUFFVILLE** — The passing of a husband or wife is a traumatic experience for the one who's left behind.

How does one cope? Where does he or she turn for advice, consolation and friendship? For many, there's no one and for these people, even in a town the size of Whitchurch-Stouffville, "it's a cold, lonely world".

Realizing this, The Family Life Centre recently set out to fill an acknowledged void in the community. The organization is called The Whitchurch-Stouffville Widowed Association. It meets the first Tuesday of each month at the F.L.C. Office on the second floor of the Credit Union Building, Main Street West.

Following the death of a loved one, the bereaved is vulnerable, Anita Waite told The Tribune, yet important decisions must be made. "He or she must deal with reality, it can be very confusing". Just to talk to someone who's faced a similar experience can be very helpful, she said.
