A public meeting will be held by the Planning Committee of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, as noted above, to present and discuss the following proposed Official Plan Amendment:

Amendment No. 7 to the Official Plan of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville planning area which changes the land use designation from 'RURAL' to 'ESTATE RESIDENTIAL' on part of LOTS 23, 24 and 25, CONCESSION 5. The subject site, comprising approximately 240 acres, has frontages on both the 5th CONCESSION ROAD (Warden Avenue) and KENNEDY ROAD (6th Concession Road) and is partially adjacent to the Canadian National Railway. The proposed Amendment is a result of an application to permit a 62 lot estate residential development.

You are invited to attend the meeting and to state your support or objection to the proposed amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting. The amending document may be examined at the Municipal Building, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville, during regular business hours. (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.)

TO PROPERTY OWNERS
TO DESTROY WEEDS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, Ontario, that unless the noxious weeds or weed seeds growing on their lands within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville are destroyed by Tuesday, June 15th, 1982, and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollen, the Council of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has appointed a Weed Inspector to cause said weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such manner as he may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Municipality against the respective lands concerned and that such amounts shall be collected in the same manner as taxes.

Although Dandelions, Burdock and Golden-rod are not considered noxious weeds within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville under the Weed Control Act, the co-operation of all citizens is solicited in the elimination of these nuisance weeds.

The co-operation of all persons concerned is earnestly solicited.
