New proposal

STOUFFVILLE — Concluding that a number of people were opposed to the construction of an apartment at the corner of Sunset Boulevard and Albert Street South, developer Ken Sandford has come up with an alternate plan. "The company has no desire to go against the wishes of local residents, so we invested in a feasibility study related to the costs of erecting a seven-store structure complex on the same site, with a density of 42 units as opposed to the original 68," he said.

The project is designed to fit unobtrusively into the surrounding area. Mr. Sandford said, with six apartments in each unit. The units will be sold to individual buyers, who, in turn, will rent them out, he explained. The con-

cept, while relatively new in Canada, is common in the United States, he said.

The firm will landscape the site with trees, allowing sufficient space on the 2.25 acre parking lot for both residents' and visitors' cars. The 2 1/2 storey buildings are designed with energy conservation in mind. Each unit will have 750 square feet of living space to include a double and single bedroom, a kitchen, a four-piece bath and a living/dining room area.

Ken Sandford admits he's excited over the new proposal. "We feel the buildings will tie in nicely with the surrounding area. They will not be look-alike facades but rather each one will be different," he concluded.

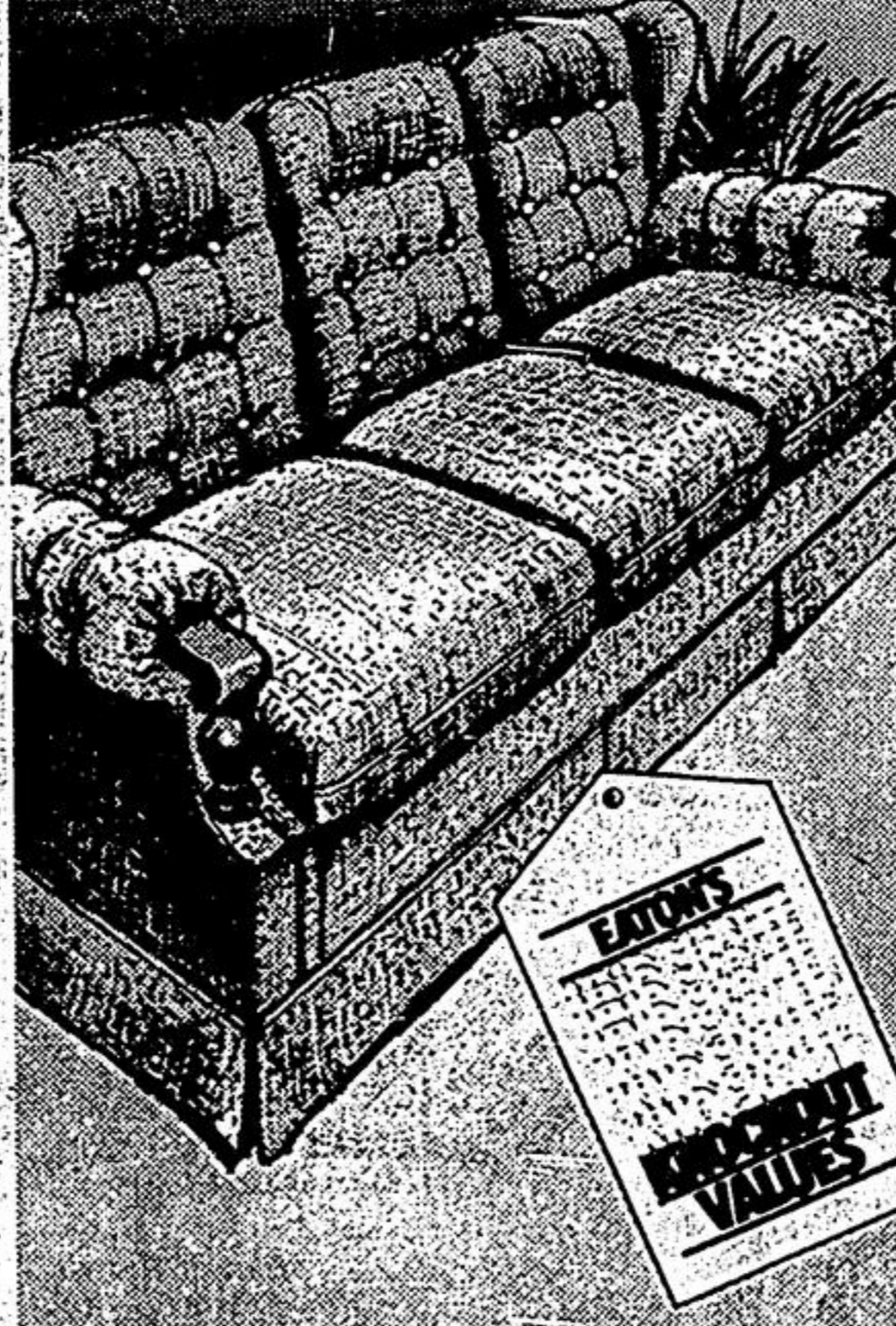
