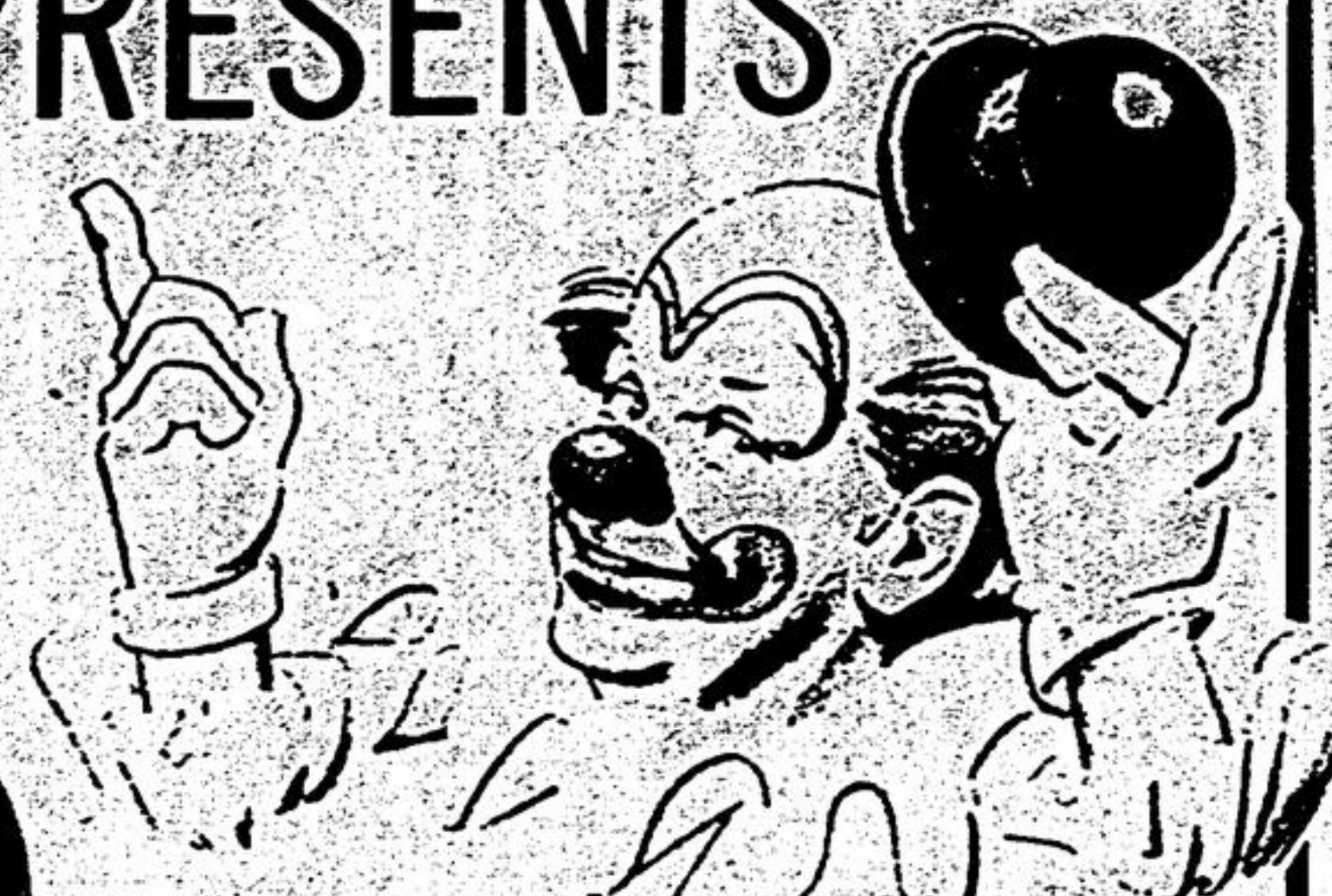

Long sandwich marks big run

STOUFFVILLE — It's Crazy Olympics time again, July 1, and what might just be the world's biggest sandwich, is going to be part of it.

For the third straight year, in what started out "with four games, as silly as you could get them," the Olympics will be staged, and with the same sort of madness in mind.

Co-ordinator, Gary Fisher, back for a second time, has lined up three big events, and promises the best of all possible competitors in all of them.

Continuing where they left off last year, the events will get underway at the town park, starting with a relay race. Only it won't be just any ordinary relay race. In this one, the members will build up a sandwich as they go along.

The first runner starts off with an empty plate; the second member then adds bread, and the remaining members add lettuce, baloney, mustard, etc.

until they have completed the sandwich and returned to their starting places in the park.

The race route is as follows: the south end of the town park; to O'Brien Avenue; to Main Street; to Park Drive, and back to the south park area.

Another game features a relay obstacle course, while the third

will take place in the town swimming pool. All the details for that haven't been worked out as yet.

There will be five teams, with six members on each. They'll be sponsored by local merchants and wear identifying hats.

Opening game time is 2 p.m.

V.I.P.s parade in T's

STOUFFVILLE — It's been a long time since the old Model T's and other members of the running board era, made their way up the town's Main Street, for all to gaze at and admire.

However, they'll be out in all their ancient glory during the Giant People Parade, July 1.

Starting at 10 a.m., when Parade Marshal, Bruce Burton, blows his whistle to get things underway from Success Square, several of the cars will fall in behind Honorary Parade Marshall, and Montreal Canadian star, Keith Acton, and proceed up the street.

They'll be carrying their own celebrities, too, with such people as Mayor Eldred King, and York—Peel MP Sinclair Stevens, and York North MPP, Bill Hodgson, comfortably ensconced in, or on top of the backs of their seats.

Organizer, Ken Patrick, said he hopes to have 15 of the cars, all dating from around 1910—20.

But forget about Al Unser and the like—the competitors will be somewhat younger. In fact, they'll be from age three to seven.

They will for the first three events — Sparrows, Robins, and Eagles — anyway. In fact, the Grand Prix, part of the July 1 Canadian Day celebrations, is mostly for the kids.

And they'll compete on three—or—four—wheel vehicles in the first event, which is for children up to three and "any big wheel

vehicle," for the next two groups of five and seven.

The piece de resistance, however, is saved for the last. That's in the Big Bird—Little Bird event, when dad or mom, and the child combine on any big wheel vehicle, and try their luck around the course. And that, according to Anne Powell, of Family Trust, "we are trying to make as diabolical as we can."

The races—all of different lengths—will take place on the Canadian Tire lot, just in front of the store area, with the first starting at 11 a.m. The winners will be honored in a ceremony at North Park, July 4, at 2:30 p.m.
