**STOUFFVILLE** — A well-known resident of Stouffville, David James Tran, died June 30, at Parkview Home. He was 96.

The late Mr Tran had lived at Parkview for the past 11 years.

Born in Scarborough, Mr. Tran resided in the Atha area of Pickering Township almost 75 years.

An excellent farmer, he achieved the reputation of being a top plowman, winning his first trophy at the age of sixteen.

He later won many more such awards over the years. He also served on the Markham Fair Board in numerous capacities, including that of president in 1958.

Mr. Tran was predeceased by his wife, the former Jane Laurie, in 1970. A son, Joe, died in 1971, and a daughter, Laurie, in 1955.

Surviving are two sisters, Ida (Mrs. Wm. Maxwell) of Markham, and Fanny (Mrs. Ed Sharpe) of Wyoming; a daughter-in-law, Freda (Mrs. H. Twyman) of Markham; nine grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.

Rev. Donald Pugh of Plattsville, and formerly of Altona, conducted the service from the Dixon-Garland Funeral Home, July 3, with interment Locust Hill Cemetery.

**STOUFFVILLE** — This community lost a highly-respected friend and a fine Christian gentleman in the passing, June 27 of Mr Clarence Doner at York Central Hospital, Richmond Hill.

Mr Doner was born at the family homestead, south-west of Gormley, Dec. 6, 1890, the son of Daniel Doner. In 1926, he purchased the property from his father and continued to reside there until building a home at New Gormley in 1946. He was a carpenter of considerable skill.

In 1958, Mr and Mrs Doner moved to Park Drive North in Stouffville, then to Parkview Apartments in 1975. One and a half years ago, they found it necessary to take up residence in the nursing home section at Parkview.

Clarence Doner was active in the work of the Gormley Missionary Church where he held the position of Sunday School superintendent 25 years. He was also president of the Whitechurch Township Sunday School Association. Later, he became involved in the congregation of the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church at Unionville.

Besides his wife, the former Margaret Baker, he is survived by three sons, Harold at Fordwich, Lloyd in Gormley, Don of Stouffville; two daughters, Gladys (Mrs Harrison Schlichter), Gormley and Helen (Mrs Fred Wilson), Toronto; 17 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

A memorial service was conducted by Rev. Ed Sparks at Parkview Home, June 30, followed by a public service in the Unionville Alliance Church, Rev. David Peresue was in charge assisted by Rev. Percy Barley, a former pastor. Interment was at Heise Hill Cemetery.
