STOUFFVILLE — Delivery of the 1982 edition of the telephone directory for York Region begins August 19.

Carolyn Passmore, local Bell Canada manager, said 129,700 directories will be delivered, about 6,000 more than in 1981. Delivery is scheduled to be completed by September 3.

The cover, front and back, features windows, through which

can be seen people in their homes. Since it is a telephone directory cover, these people are all using the telephone.

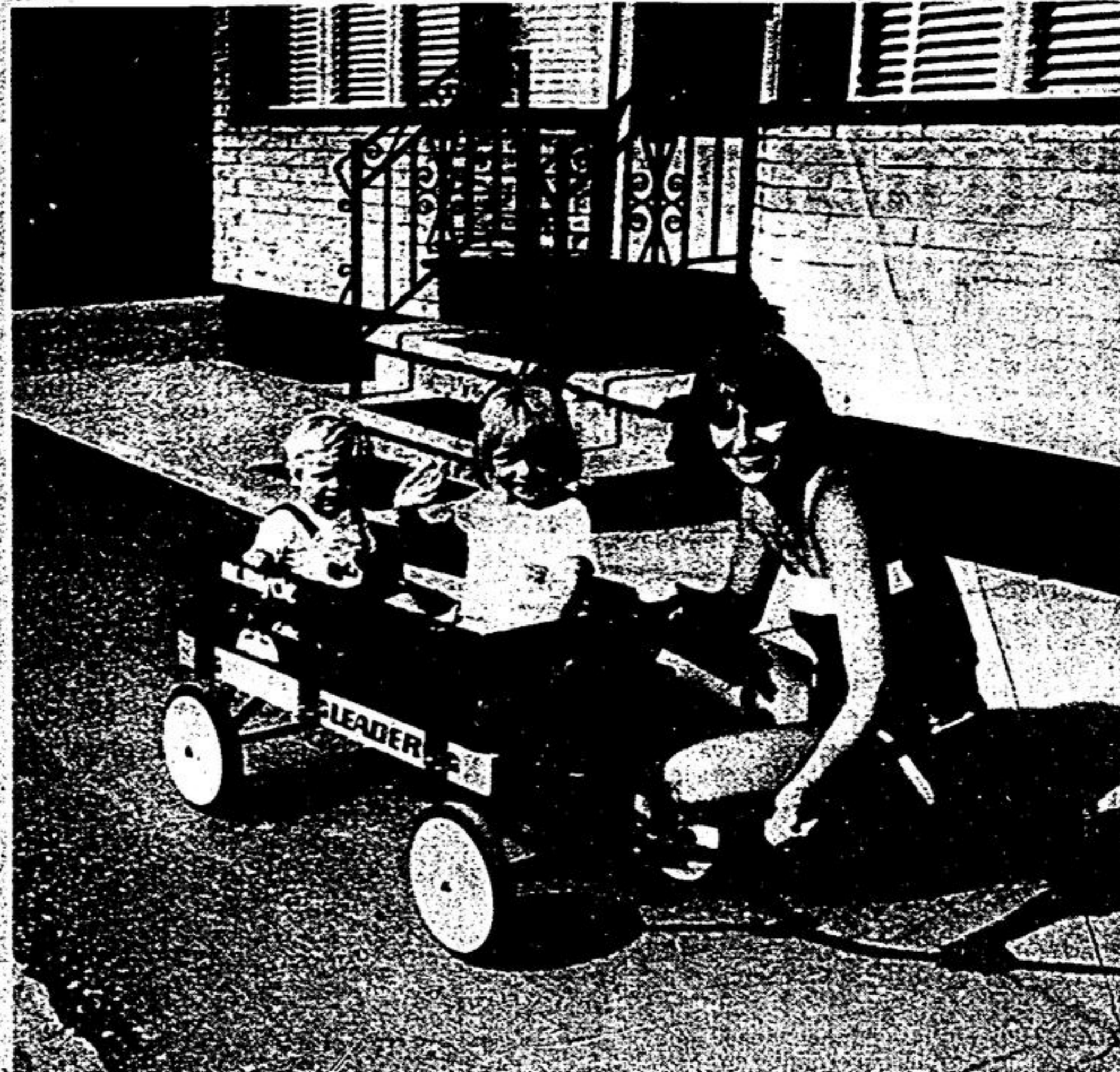
The HELP! page has been moved to the inside cover, making it easy to find police, fire, ambulance and other emergency numbers.

On the inside back cover is a reproduction of an oil painting of Bass Lake, north of Brockville, by a Cornwall artist who became
