And, while Fox raised millions, those participating in Stouffville, hope to gather enough through their pledges that, when put with all the other pledges across the country, they'll help add up to a sum that even the curly-headed cancer victim, himself, would have been proud of.

Following is the route, as mapped out

by Dixie Sellers and her band of organizers: Line up at Latcham Hall at 1:30 p.m. Head off in a southeasterly direction through Thicketwood, to Success Square.

Up Main Street to Montreal St., to North St., and then down to Church St., back to Main and the Library, half-way point and rest spot.

Those making it that far, will be rewarded with a cold drink.

Fully refreshed, the group will proceed up Main to Albert, over to Rupert, then the 9th Concession, Fairview to Elm, to Glengal, to the 9th, Main, Orchard Park, Sunset, Albert, Main, Rose; then up Russell to Burkholder and back to Latcham Hall.

Certificates outlining their accomplishment, and cold drinks, will be distributed at the home base.

Mrs. Sellers said the route takes "a shade over two hours," but stressed that it wasn't a race, and participants could go at their own pace.

No bicycles will be allowed.

Church team. Come and enjoy Joni Erickson's film, "Reflections of His Love," at 7:30 p.m., Sept. 5, at the Missionary Church.

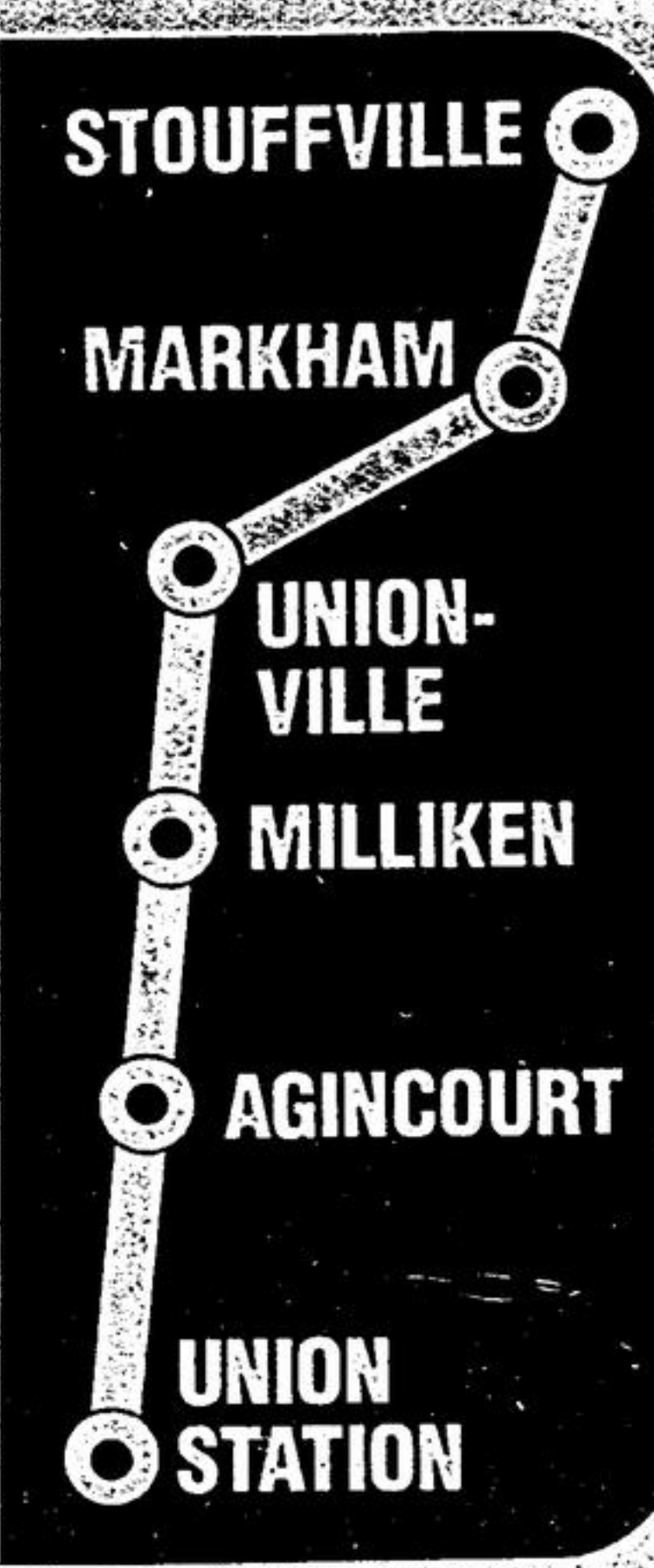
### Players please!

## MUNICIPAL ENUMERATION

Starting September 7, 1982, an enumerator, carrying a proper identification card, will call at your residence for a few minutes to check basic information required in determining:

- your eligibility to vote in the municipal and school board elections to be held on November 8 this year;
- the allocation of education property taxes between the public and separate school systems;
- the distribution of provincial grants to local governments to help reduce tax bills;
- the preparation of jurors' lists; and
- population information needed for other municipal programs.

The enumerator must record such information as the name, age, property status (e.g. owner or tenant), school support and residency of all members of the household.

This year in certain areas the enumerator will also ask if you would like your name included on a list of electors for French-language schools.

When the enumerator visits, please check that the information on the Enumeration Notice is correct. If it is not, revise it and verify the changes.

If you are not home, a Notice will be left for you. If changes are necessary, please make them and mail the Enumeration Notice, as soon as possible, in the pre-addressed postage prepaid envelope accompanying the Notice. For any additional information, please contact the local assessment office.
