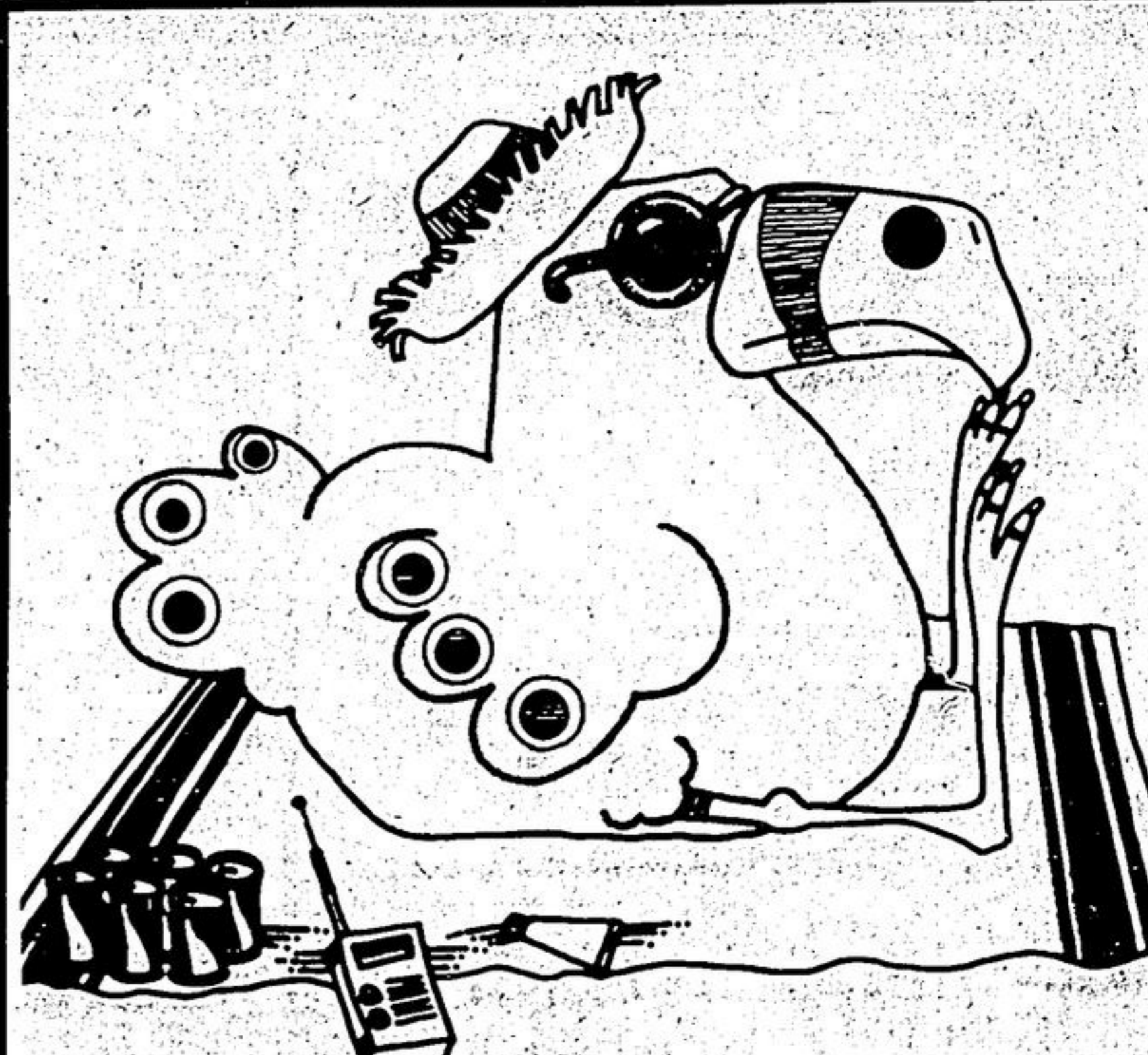

May look at
board costs
STOUFFVILLE - A request from a York Regional councillor to Town Council for a joint meeting to discuss school board spending, met with a mixed reaction at a meeting of council, last week.
The request was made by Georgina representative, John McLean, who thought the board needed a staying hand in its financial dealings. Mayor Eldred King, who led off the discussion, didn't think the board's business was that of council's. "They have elected representatives for that," said the mayor. "If Mr. McLean wants to be involved, he can run for the school board."
Councillor Charles Warden, however, disagreed. "We're the people responsible for collecting money for that board. It behooves us to see that the taxpayers get their money's worth," Councillor Warden said. "I wasn't elected to do that," replied Mayor King. "We're obligated to collect taxes, but there is a representative on the board whose responsibility is to see to those expenditures..."
Council "must keep in mind the total impact on the taxpayers when it sets the mill rates," said Councillor Warden.
Councillor Wilf Morley said he had "felt the same" as the mayor, until he read Councilor's McLean's plea to "put our heads together to see if we can find ways to reduce costs."
If the councils faced the matter "with that spirit in mind," some accomplishment could probably be made, he said.
Said Mayor King: "I think we have always had that avenue of communication open."
Councilor Tom Wood wondered how "we'd feel if the board came to us and told us how to spend our money?"
On a suggestion by Councilor Warden, council agreed to inform Councilor McLean that it would participate in a meeting if it were set up.

UXBRIDGE - Members of township council, all outspoken at various times during the year, were less vocal last week when asked about their plans for the coming municipal election.
With the exception of Councilor Sandy Ewen, who said he expected to be back "running for council again," they said they needed more time to think about it. Councilor Maustyn McKnight said he felt it was "too early" to start making public announcements about the matter. People weren't interested right now.
"I've got a couple of week-ends when I want to get away," he said. "If I run, I'll know what for."
Said Councilor Don Jackson: "There are many other things to be accomplished before that. I'll need my time for them."
Councilor Gerri-Lynn O'Connor said she needed another week to think about it. "Then I'll give it my fullest attention," she said.
Councilor Ron Johnson was even less committal. "Don't you know?" he said, and left it at that.
