### CABLE T.V. RATE INCREASE

### CABLE T.V. SUBSCRIBERS IN THE TOWNS OF VAUGHAN, MARKHAM, RICHMOND HILL AND WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE

On November 27, 1981, Classic Communications Ltd. applied to the CRTC to increase the basic rate for cable television service by \$1.00 per month to \$8.50 and that application was dealt with at a public hearing on March 30, 1982.

In its June 28th budget, the Federal Government announced a program of restraint to reduce inflation. This has become known as the 6% - 5% solution. While it was addressed to industry and business as a whole, it placed particular emphasis on federally regulated industries, such as cable television and Bell Canada.

Classic Communications has responded to that program by reducing its rate increase application to \$7.95 or an increase of only \$45 per month. This complies with the 6% guideline and the application has now been approved by CRTC decision #82-767, effective September 1st, 1982.

Effective September 1, 1982 cable TV rates will be as follows:

1st TV SET \$7.95 PER MONTH  
ADDITIONAL TV SETS \$3.15 PER MONTH EACH

Cable television statements after September 1st will reflect these new rates. Cable charges already billed at the old rate for any period after September 1, 1982 will be adjusted on your next statement.

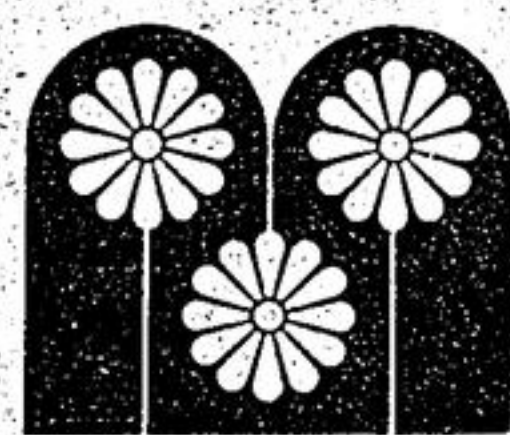
