1971 cavie entry got her involved in the local fair

Cavies (Guinea Pigs)! Needlecraft! Cake Decorating!
Question: What do the above have in common?

Answer: They're all part of Markham Fair and they're all interests of Jennie Mann, this year's President of the Ladies' Section of Markham Fair. As well, each has a special meaning for her.

Jennie's first exhibit at the Fair in 1971 was a Guinea Pig when she was living in Scarborough and the entry was made as a result of her membership in the Markham Poultry and Pet Association.

In 1972 she moved to Markham and through the invitation of Mrs. Kay Thompson (Ladies' President in 1974) began to work in the Needlecraft exhibits. That year she exhibited a stuffed (fabric) handmade frog and won the class.

About the same time she began a new hobby — Cake Decorating — and after much practice became sufficiently adept at the skill that she provided the first

ever cake decorating demonstration at Markham Fair.

Born in Essex, England, Jennie came to Canada with her parents, who incidentally also live in Markham, in 1950. Her father was employed by the Ministry of Correctional Services and as a result she "lived in many communities" in Ontario.

Besides her other activities Mrs. Mann has had a "wonderful time" working with young people at the Fair. In 1977 following the death of Miss Olive Shadlock, a director of the Fair who had been in charge of the 18 and Under Exhibits for many years, Jennie accepted the role of chairing that committee. These exhibits involve pre-schoolers, mentally handicapped youngsters and high school students.

Mrs. Mann, who is a pleasant person with an active sense of humor, recalled an incident when she was exhibiting a Peruvian Guinea Pig at the Fair. "It had very long hair

and I was holding it in my hand combing out the hair when this man came up to me and said 'why are you combing your wig in such a public place lady' and I admit for a minute I was stuck for an answer."

Jennie is strong in her praise for the people of the Fair.

"I will always remember the fellowship and support of the members when Roy (Roy Thorpe, her previous husband and a former fair director) passed away," she said.

In 1981 Jennie married Gerald Mann, secretary-manager of the Fair, and was of great assistance to him when he carried out his duties as President of the A and B Fairs Association that year. Jennie has two daughters, Dawn and Wendy, who are also active in Fair committees.

She feels her year as President of the Ladies' Section has been full and worthwhile to date although she has a number of things yet to accom-

plish. This year there will be a new class of exhibit for Procelain Lace Dolls. These are handmade delicately created china-like dolls and must be seen to be fully appreciated.

There will also be a number of demonstrations in the Homecraft Building featuring cake decorating, quilting bees and other interesting domestic science activities. There will also be food processing demonstrations.

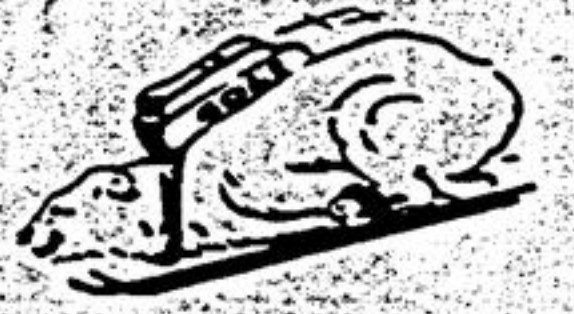

LEE WALSH, CANADIAN ARTIST AT MARKHAM FAIR

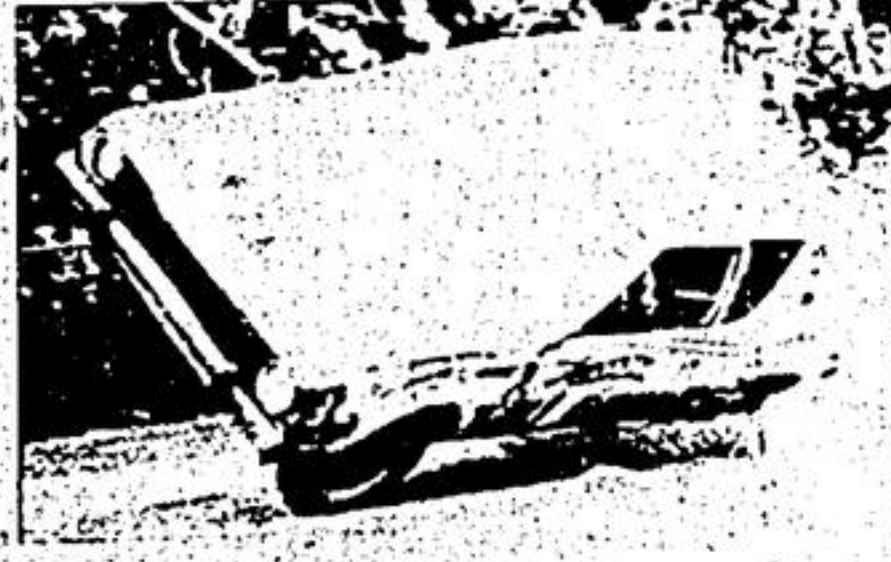

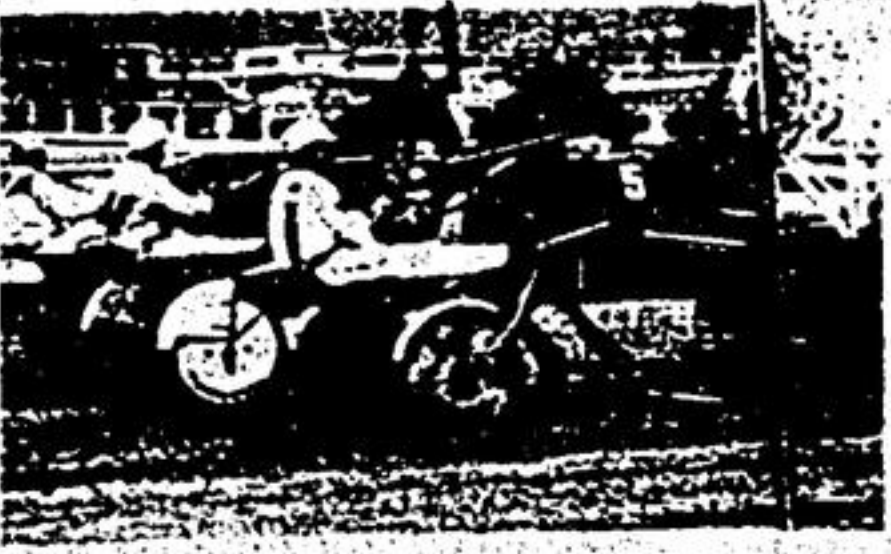

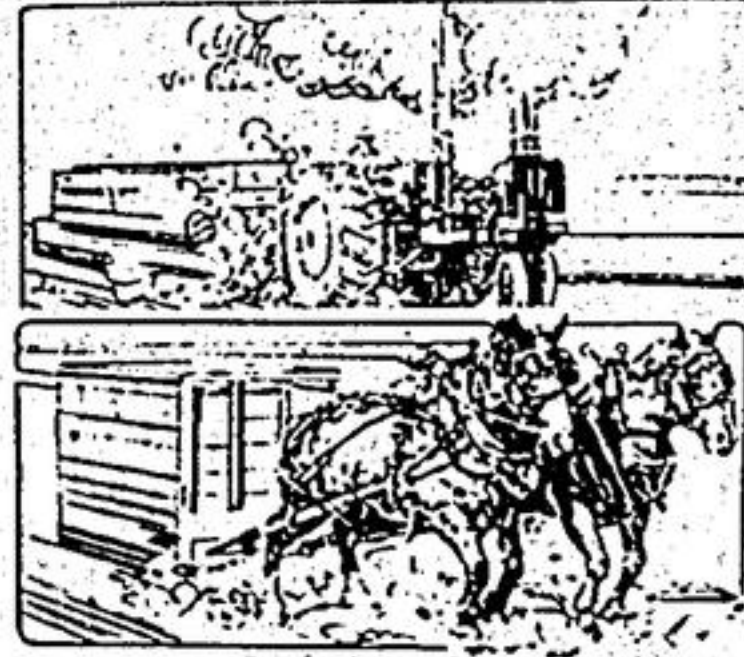
