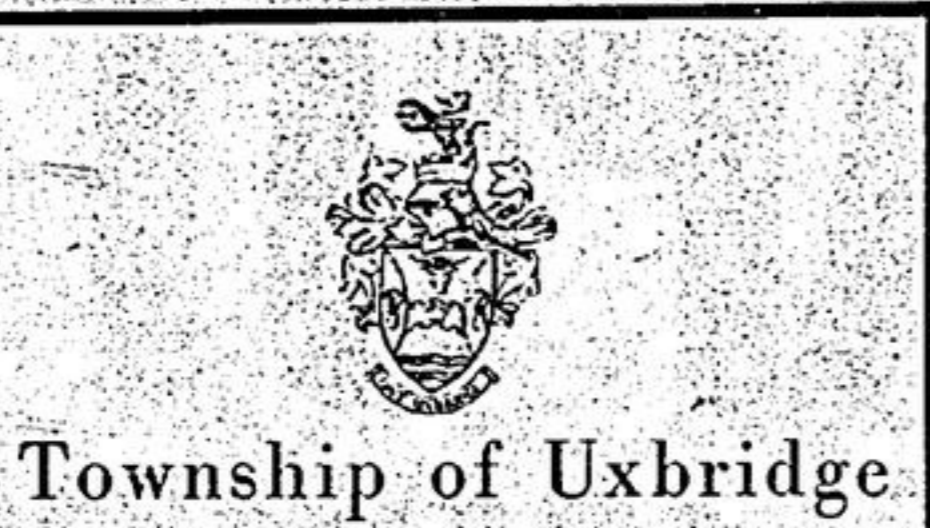


Fine performance by local rider

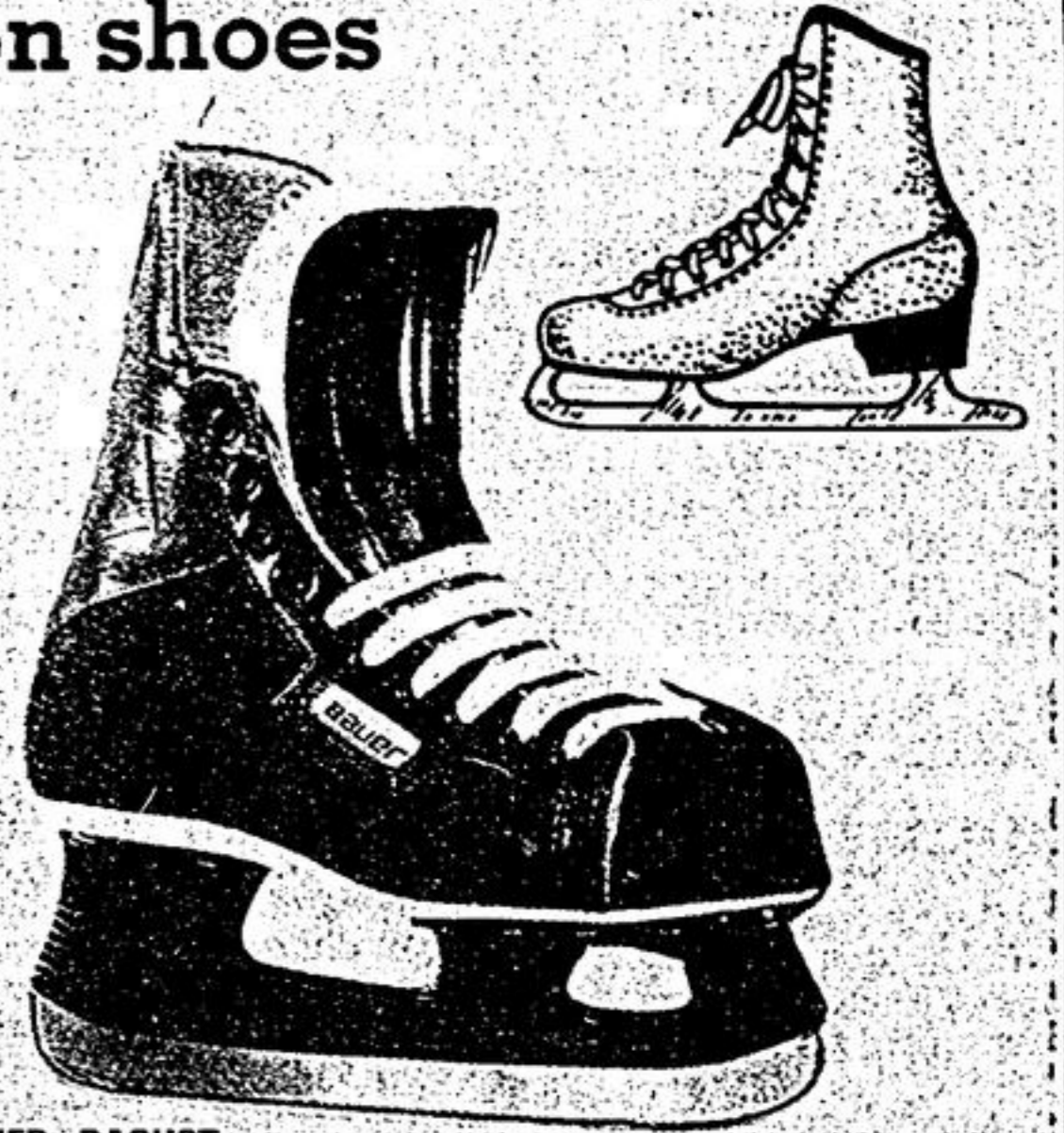

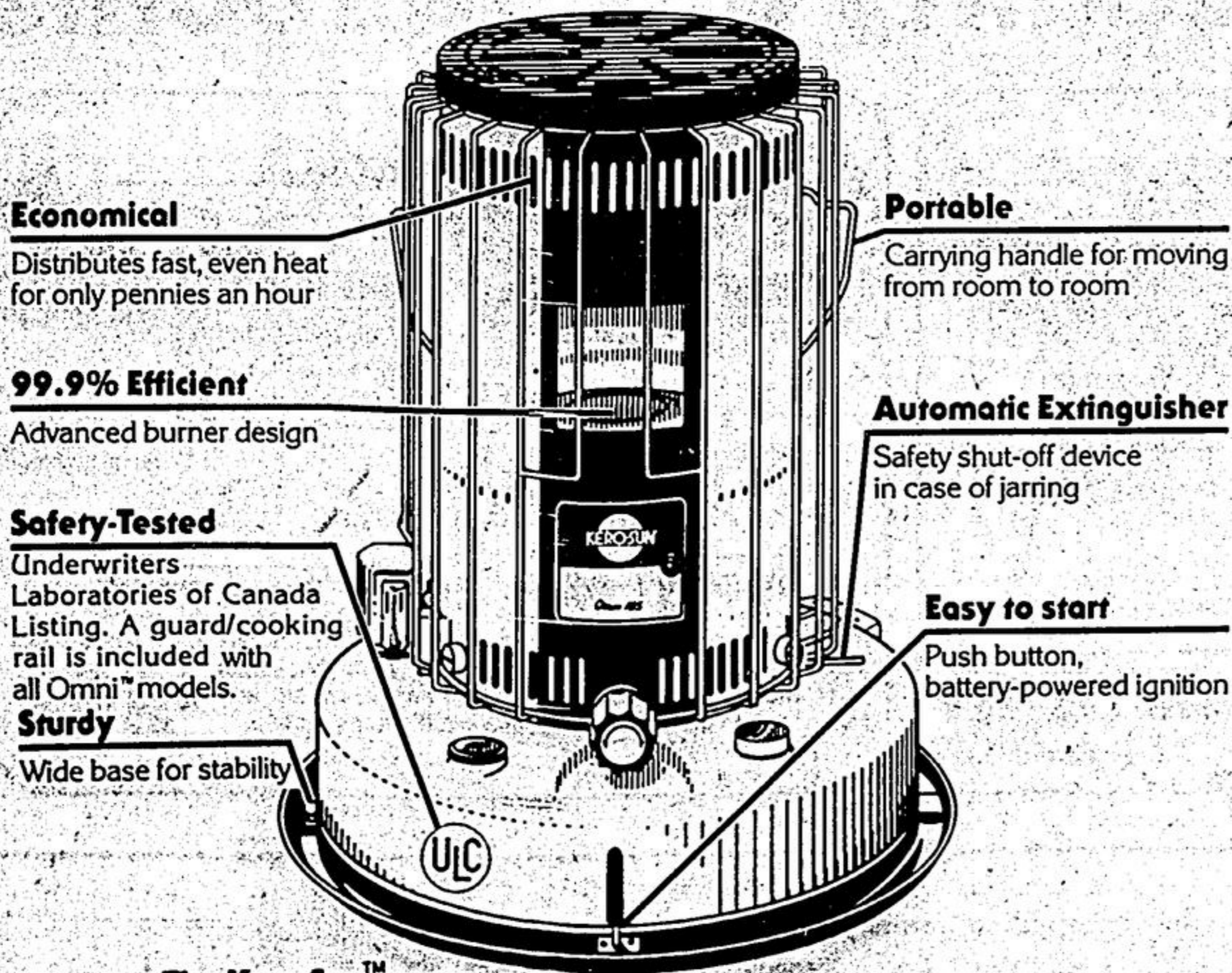
