YORK REGION — Paul Hulsbof, R.R. 4, Stouffville, has been named president of York Region Federation of Agriculture. The annual meeting was held Oct. 20 at Victoria Square Community Centre.

He succeeds outgoing president Harold Lapp, R.R. 2, Markham.

Harvey Brown, R.R. 2, Markham, is 1st vice-president. Second vice-president is Barton Johnson of Sutton.

Named to the directorate from Whitechurch-Stouffville were Dr. Terry O'Connor, Ted Barry, Bryan Gibson and David Paisley.

Markham area directors are Harold Lapp, Harvey Brown, David Whittemore and Arthur Schickendanz.

President Paul Hulsbof is also the director of delegate for Stouffville Co-operative. Another local resident, Paul Chepak, Ninth Line South, will represent the Toronto Vegetable Growers Association, while Norman Lehman, Watson Drive, Stouffville, will represent Stouffville District Credit Union. A Gormley area resident, John Rumble, was named delegate from the York Region Crop Improvement Association.

Farmers - unite!

YORK REGION — Farmers of the world unite. These words spoken at the annual meeting of the York County Federation of Agriculture, represented the message from guest speaker, Del O'Brien, provincial Ministry of

Agriculture representative, Al Wall, and various committee heads within the York group.

Discussing the small return a farmer obtains from the market place for the amount of work he does, O'Brien, a Pem-

broke farmer and lawyer, said: "It's so hard to understand a farmer's reluctance to join a collective. That's one of the ABCs. 'There's no equity between a lion and a mouse,' he told his listeners. 'One farmer at a time, is not going to stand in the market place.'"

O'Brien said there had to be a "countervailing force, and that is organized labor. Maybe it's gone too far, but it's played its role in getting a fair return."

"You live like paupers; you're all just stewards and you pass it on," O'Brien said.

He urged the members to work together and to take advantage of the collective opportunities open to them in the management of their farms.

Alan Wall listed the weather and econo-

mics as the main problems facing the farmer, and said that "one of the weak links has been in farm owners knowing where they're at at any given time; to take advantage of the Ontario Farm Adjustment Program to operate their business."

He said that farmers needed "accurate net worth statements and inventory listings. It takes a joint effort to strengthen farm management operations." Wall ended.

Outgoing president, Harold Lapp, told the meeting that lack of "communication" between board directors and members, was a "problem," while public relations director, Tom Perkes, said that, "a net decrease in membership is often indicative of a bigger problem."

He said members had to "get back to basics," remembering how they had worked together to build the organization.

"We won't get there unless there is more member involvement," he said.

Barton Johnson, head of the membership committee, also stressed the need for new people. "The members must know the federation is a benefit to them," he said.
