"Be suspicious"
Friend - foe?

WHITCHURCH — "Be suspicious". That, in brief, was the advice given homeowners attending a Block Parent sponsored meeting at Whitchurch-Highlands School, Thursday night.

The warning, issued by Constable Peter Bullivant, York Regional Police, was related to strangers who call for a variance of reasons.

"Notify the police—it may seem silly; it could be embarrassing, but it could save you a lot of trouble," officer Bullivant told his audience.

The constable said that, in the majority of instances, a cruiser can be at a house in less than five minutes.

The speaker informed his listeners that a break-in occurs every thirteen seconds in Canada. Target times, he said, are between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.; 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. Suggested deterrents outlined in-

cluded—informing a neighbor if you're going away; leaving lights and the radio on; owning a pet dog (that barks); and keeping all doors and windows securely locked.

"Never put the front door key under a mat or in a flower pot," the officer warned.

In built-up areas, Constable Bullivant recommended the setting up of organizations called "Neighborhood Watch" in which people watch other people's homes. The Police Department, he said, is pleased to arrange this

kind of community plan.

One mother in the audience was highly critical of the judicial system whereby the would-be thief is too often given preferential treatment, should he be shot by the person whose property he intends to steal. If faced with such a situation, where her life or the lives of her children were in danger "I'd shoot him right between the ears", she said.

Another lady said that, faced with a similar situation "my legs would go like jelly".
