## Local rider is number one

A stunning season's performance by local motorcycle racer, Kevin Hamilton of Glengall Lane, Stouffville, has put the young 22 year old at the top of the tree in the 125cc Grand Prix racing circles.

His masterful and gutsy performance this year has been impressive. Three first places at Sanair, Quebec; three firsts and Shannonsville, Ont.; two firsts at Watkins Glen, New York State, and three firsts at Pocono, Pennsylvania, have produced not only an Eastern Canadian 125cc Amateur Champion but a North-East American formula 4 and 5 champion as well.

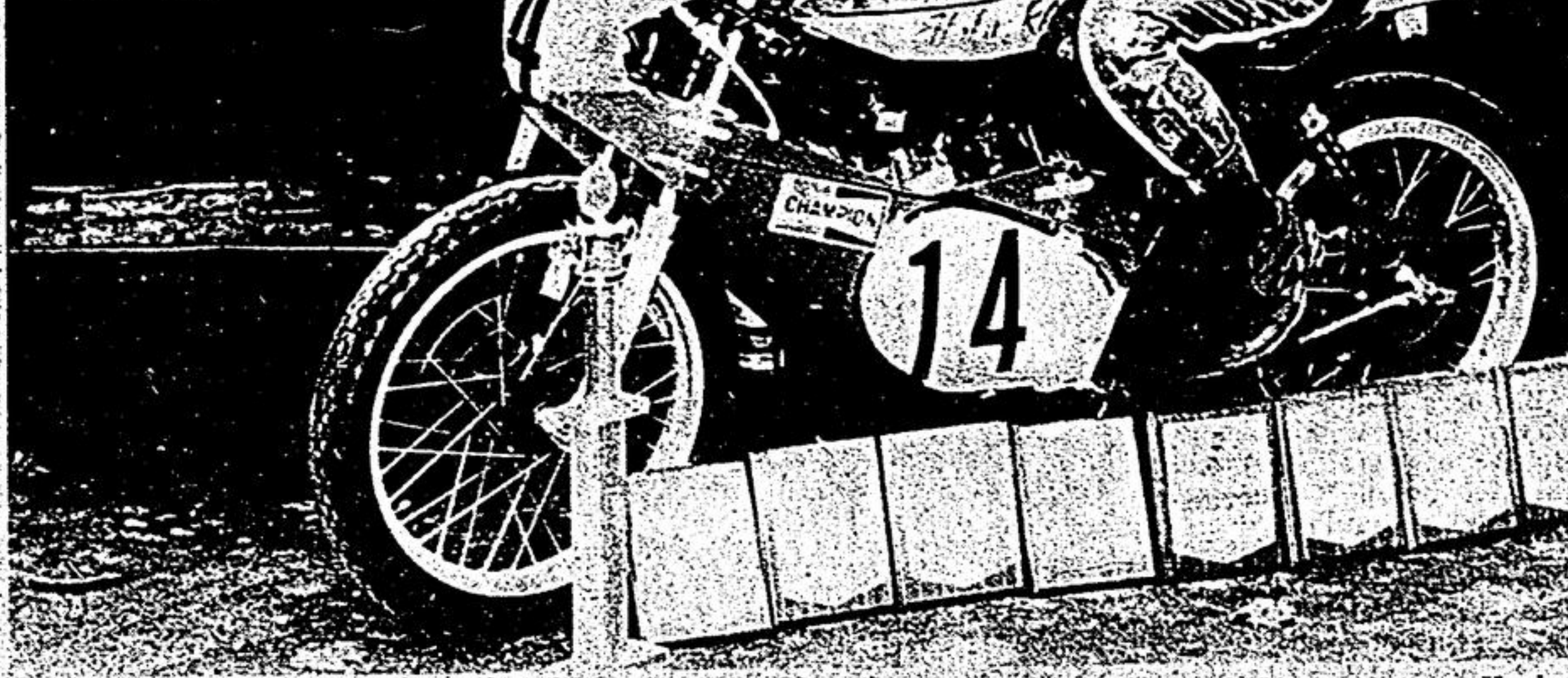
The trip to the top has not been an easy one. As a private entry the costs are phenomenal. However, he has managed to attract a few local sponsors. But the costs are only partly met by sponsorship.

The season has brought it's fair share of problems to the young rider, although his list of impressive wins do not indicate it. At Mosport on May 24 he crashed, causing considerable damage to his Honda. Despite mechanical problems during the month of October, with the season coming to a close, he still managed a creditable fifth in a field of

over 45 riders. Some indication of Kevin's ability is the fact that he also succeeded in getting a second and two thirds in the 250cc class this season; almost unheard of when riding a bike with an engine half the size of the competition.

The results of his performance in the Georgia Grand Nationals are not available at the time of going to press. However, if Honda have any spare "works" machinery around for next season they couldn't do better than entrust it to this very talented and courageous rider.

Chris has been playing hockey since he was 6 years old and has worked his way through most of the Allstar teams; from Novice right through to Bantam.

A grade 11 student at SDSS, he also plays basketball, baseball and is a top competitor in track events.

Partnering Chris on the line are two other fine young players, Bill Hutchison (Jnr) and Lee Brown.

Chris has tallied

seven goals in his last two games; five against Sutton on Friday night and two in Sunday's game against Uxbridge.
