- résider dans le secteur qui relève de la compétence du conseil; et
- dans le cas,
  - d'un conseil d'écoles publiques, être électeur des écoles publiques;
  - d'un conseil d'écoles séparées catholiques, être électeur des écoles séparées;
  - d'un membre d'un conseil de l'éducation par les électeurs des écoles publiques, être électeur des écoles publiques; et
  - d'un membre d'un conseil de l'éducation élu par les électeurs des écoles séparées, être électeur des écoles séparées.

**ATTENTION: FRENCH-SPEAKING RATEPAYERS OF YORK REGION**  
**French Language Advisory Committee for Secondary Schools**

Two meetings are being called for Tuesday, December 7, 1982 at 8:00 p.m. to elect six French speaking ratepayers to serve on the French Language Advisory Committee of The York Region Board of Education for the next three years.

The meeting to elect two persons to represent French speaking ratepayers who reside south of Hwy. 7 will be held in the Resource Centre of Thornhill Secondary School, 167 Dudley Ave., Thornhill. For those who reside north of Hwy. 7, four persons will be elected representatives at a meeting in Room 219 at Newmarket High School, 329 Prospect St., Newmarket.

The Advisory Committee shall make recommendations to the School Board with respect to ways and means of meeting the educational and cultural needs of French speaking pupils in York Region.

Eligibility to serve on this committee is restricted to those French speaking ratepayers who have the qualifications required but are not members of the Board of Education as outlined in the Education Act 1981, namely:

196 (1) A person is qualified to be elected as a member of a board if he is:

- a Canadian citizen;
- of the full age of eighteen years;
- a resident within the area of jurisdiction of the board; and
- in the case of,
  - a public school board, a public school elector;
  - a Roman Catholic separate school board a separate school elector;
  - a member of a board of education to be elected by public school electors, a public school elector; and
  - a member of a board of education to be elected by separate school electors, a separate school elector.

## Arguello relaxes after title fight

# Title contender in town for visit

Returning to Stouffville after nearly fifteen years, world welterweight contender Alexis Arguello was in town on Saturday to visit friends and family.

The handsome, thirty-year-old Nicaraguan, looking fit and well, was full of high spirits despite losing his fight with Aaron Pryor in Miami, Florida, on November 12.

In an interview with The Tribune, Arguello discussed his loss and future plans for the pending rematch.

Admitting he had overtrained for the title-fight, Arguello said he was putting in an average of eighty minutes a day on road work, exceeding his usual time by nearly double; he was also a

few pounds under his best weight when it came to weigh-in time.

Asked if he felt there was any time during the fight when he could have caught Pryor, Arguello said: "I caught him a couple of good punches in the eleventh and should have gone in then, but didn't. I'll know better next time."

The only sign of wear and tear on Arguello was a slight scar under his left eye, where Pryor's combination punch in the fourteenth round opened it up, causing the referee to stop the bout after Arguello had been pounded senseless to the canvas and awarding a technical K.O. to Pryor. At no time was there any doubt that Arguello could have

continued. It took his seconds several minutes to bring him around.

The rematch promises to draw an even bigger gate than the last fight; forty-five thousand people saw the last one on closed-circuit television. The venue will probably be at Caesar's Palace, Las Vegas, according to Arguello, and will be held in March.

Also visiting with the defeated contender were his beautiful wife Loretta and two children, Alexis Jr. and Roberto. They were visiting friends and family, particularly his cousin, Joe Amador of Summitview school, who is head custodian at Summitview school. Joe held a party for the visiting fighter and his
