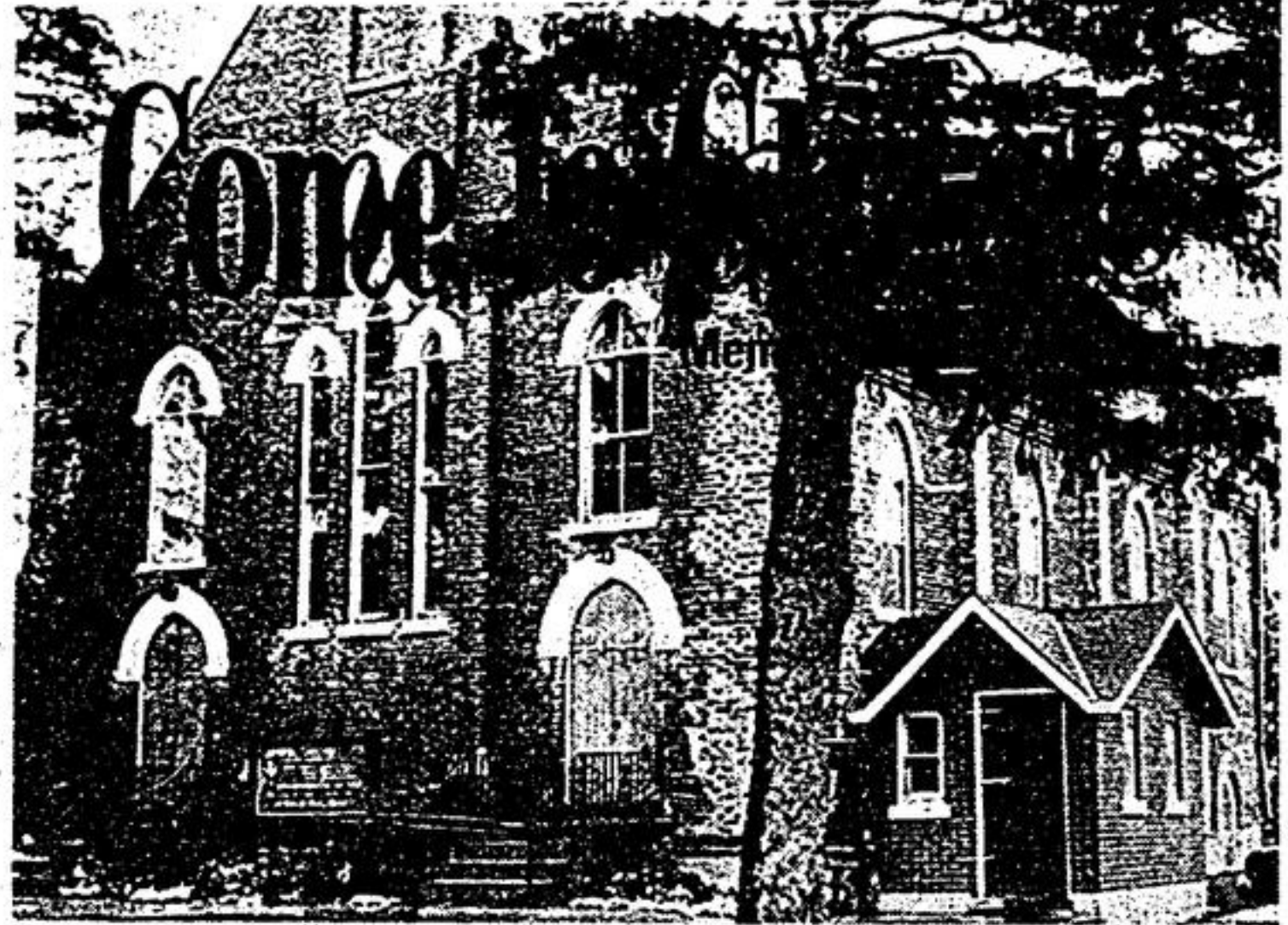
Aid Family
