Peewee and below. You have just enticed your son, or team, into the penalty box. The objective of this column is to present, illustrate and explain to the players, coaches and fans the rules of minor hockey. Referees' Corner will attempt to cover such topics as penalties, equipment and playing rules. This week we deal with body-checking.

Rule 50(b) NEW/Body-checking
"In categories of Peevee and below, a minor penalty shall be assessed any player who intentionally body-checks, bumps, shoves or pushes any opposing player. When the attacking player is skating towards the defending player, the defending player has a right to maintain his position. In this case the attacking player must avert body contact."

Situation 1.
Player 'A' has possession of the puck and is skating towards player 'B'. Player 'B' is standing on the blue line. 'A' skates into 'B' and both fall to the ice; both coaches are screaming 'body-check'. Who is correct?
Answer: If 'B' held his ground and made to attempt to check 'A', then 'A' is assessed a minor penalty for body-checking.

Situation 2.
Player 'A' has possession of the puck and is skating along the boards. Player 'B' rides 'A' into the boards by bumping into him. 'A's coach screams 'body-check'. Player 'B's coach is jumping for joy because his player made a good check. Who is correct?
Answer: Coach 'A'. Riding off a player is permitted as long as no contact occurs between players. Since body contact did occur, 'B' is assessed a minor penalty.

Body-checking is allowed only in the following divisions: Boys Allstar, Bantam and above. Girls' Allstar and Senior divisions. Body-checking is not allowed in a house league team in Whitechurch-Stouffville.

Question of the week.
Player 'A' has possession of the puck. Player 'B' is behind 'A'. Player 'B' is waving to his mother in the stands. 'A' skates backwards into 'B' and both players fall to the ice.
Who is penalized?

Notice of PUBLIC MEETING
ON OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 13
Tuesday, January 18th, 1983 at 8:00 p.m.
in the Municipal Building, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville.

A public meeting will be held by the Planning Committee of the Town of Whitechurch-Stouffville, as noted above, to present and discuss the following proposed Official Plan Amendment:

Amendment No. 13 to the Official Plan of the Town of Whitechurch-Stouffville planning area which changes the land use designation from "RURAL" to "COMMUNITY RESIDENTIAL" in the west part of LOT 10, CONCESSION 9, at BLOOMINGTON.

The amendment area comprises approximately 35 acres and fronts on the south side of Bloomington Road (Regional Road No. 40) adjacent to and immediately east of the existing community of BLOOMINGTON.

Generally, a "COMMUNITY RESIDENTIAL" designation permits single family residential development with a minimum lot size of 20,000 square feet.

Approval of this Amendment could result in the development of 34 single family residential lots with a minimum lot size of 39,000 square feet.

You are invited to attend the meeting and to state your support or objection to the proposed amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting. The amending document may be examined at the Municipal Building, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville, during regular business hours: (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.)
