Dean and Carol Boland accompanied by Clint and Connie, enjoyed the weekend at Bracebridge with Bryan and Wendy Boland and family.

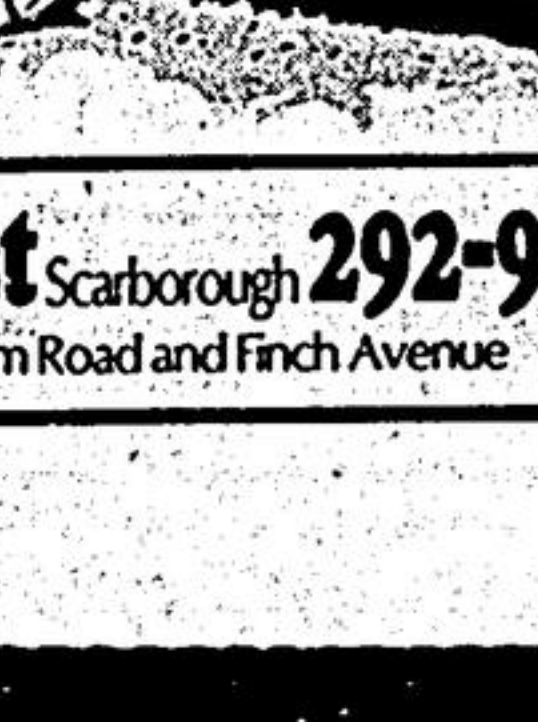
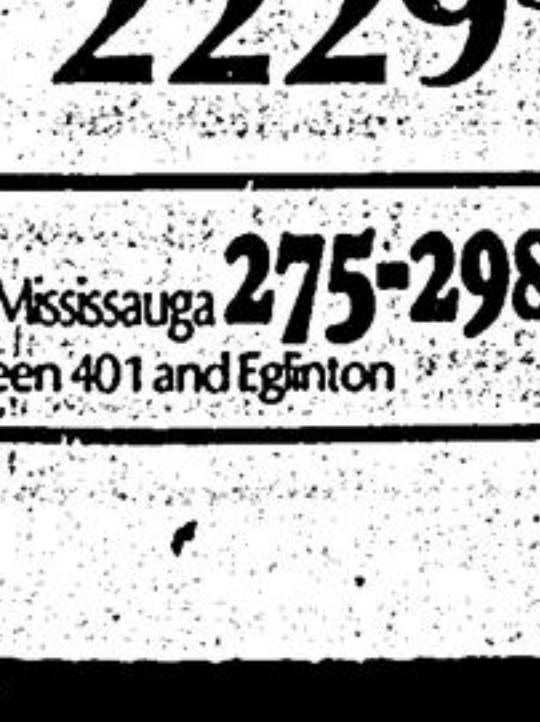
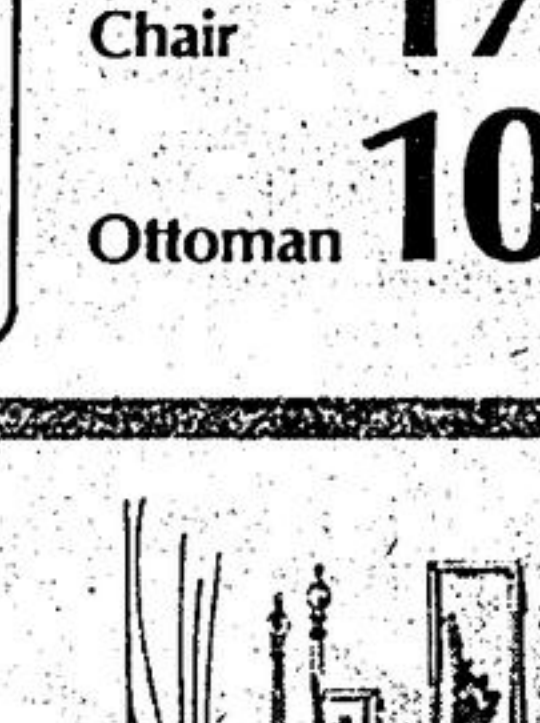
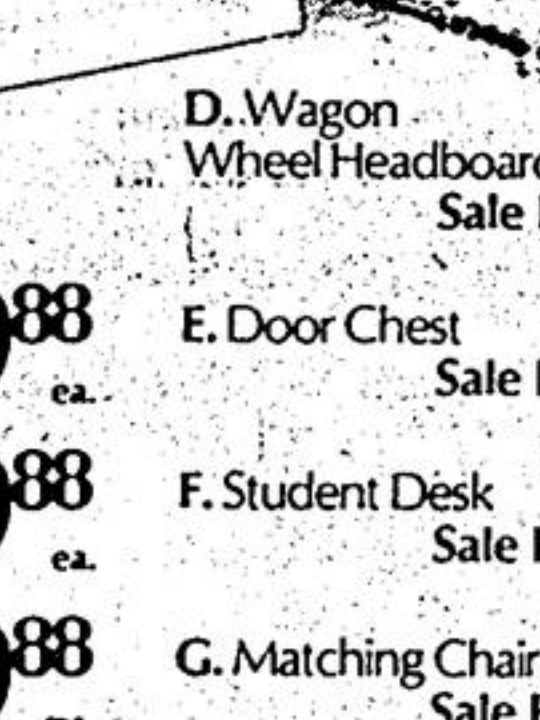
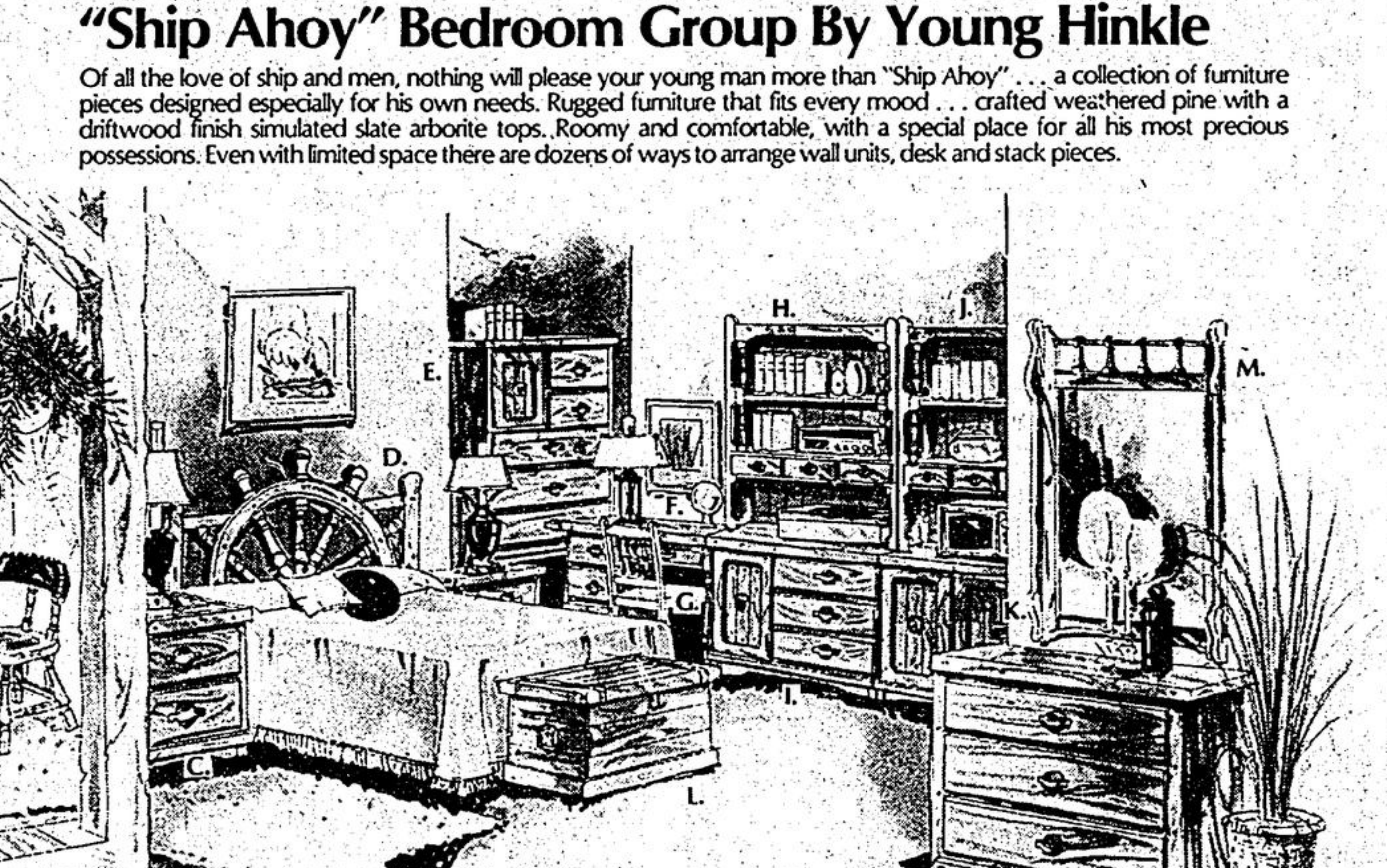
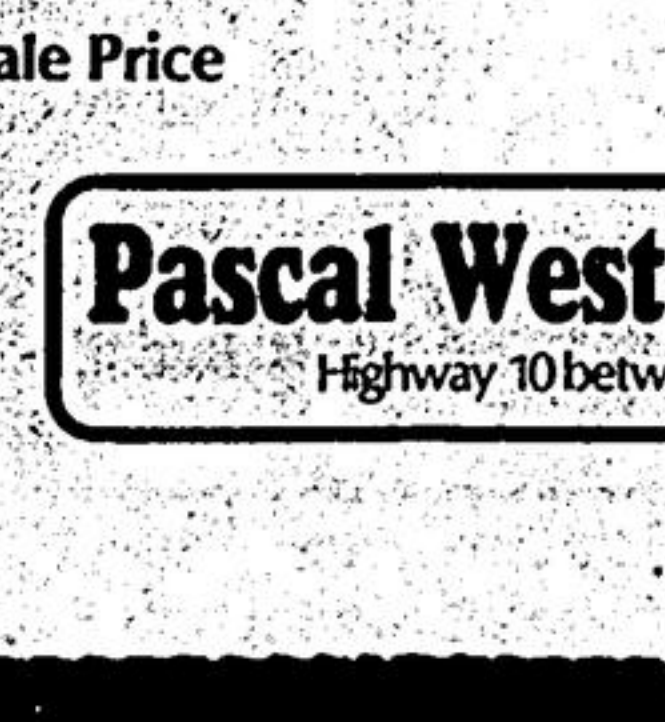
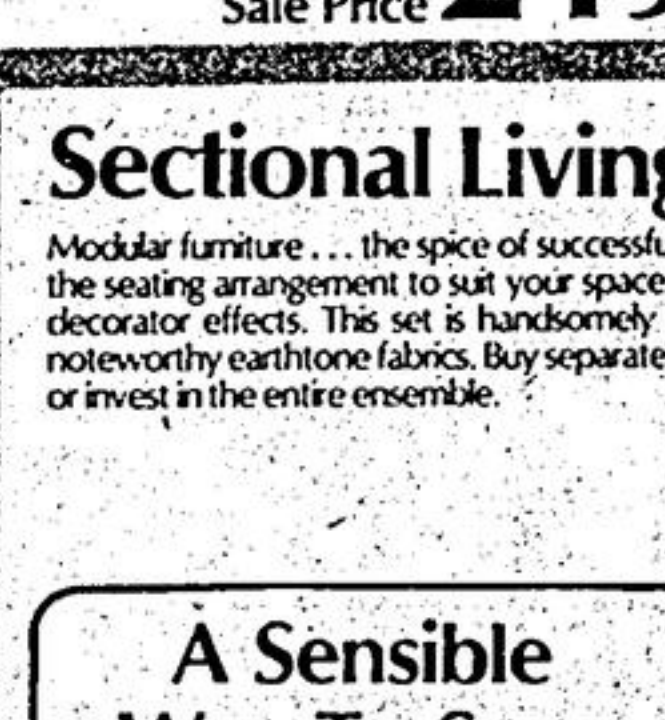
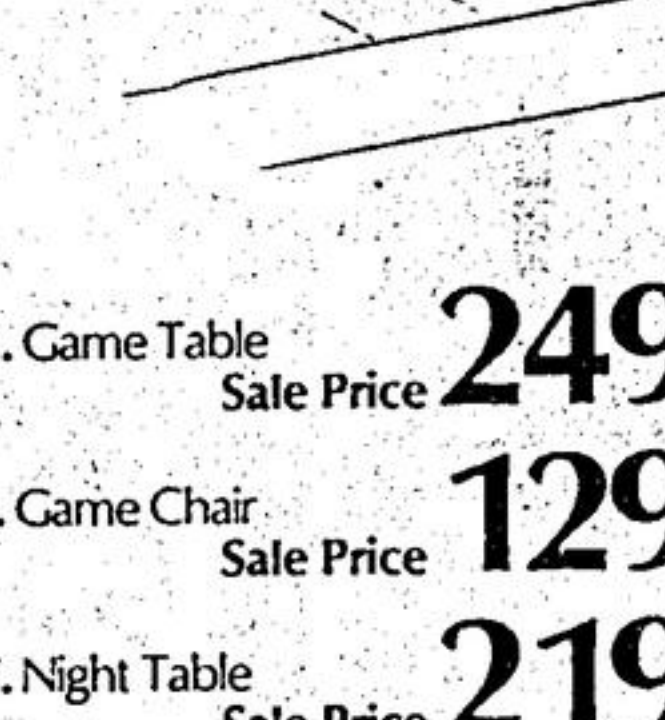
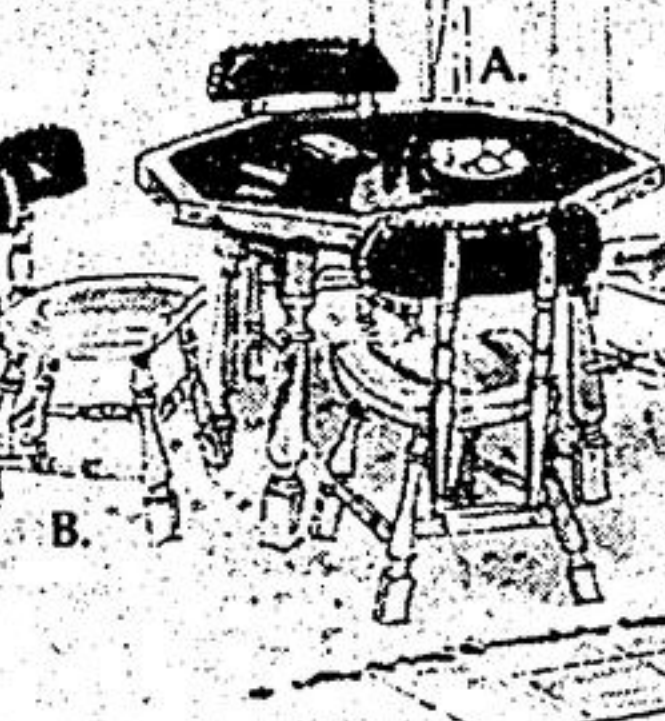
