**Expand search**

Dear Sir:  
 The State of New Jersey is currently involved in an extensive search for individuals wanted in connection with the murder of New York State Trooper Phillip Lamomaco, that occurred Dec. 21, 1981 in Warren County, New Jersey.

Thomas William Manning, wanted on a federal warrant for bank robbery and Richard Charles Williams, have been charged with this murder. In addition, Manning may be accompanied by his wife, Carol Ann, also wanted on a federal warrant for bank robbery.

Raymond Luc Levasseur, a known close associate of Manning, is also wanted on a federal warrant for bank robbery. Levasseur is wanted by this authority for questioning as to his know-

ledge of Trooper Lamomaco's death.

These fugitives have a communal-type lifestyle. They prefer renting in rural areas such as farm houses. However, they will easily adapt to urban living if the need arises. We feel that a public awareness of this group, may develop some information that will lead to their arrest. We are directing this letter to weekly newspapers like The Stouffville Tribune, since it is felt such readers are most apt to come in contact with the fugitives during day-to-day activities.

Nothing has developed in the investigation that indicates these fugitives are, in fact, in your area. However, there's always a possibility they may be living there.

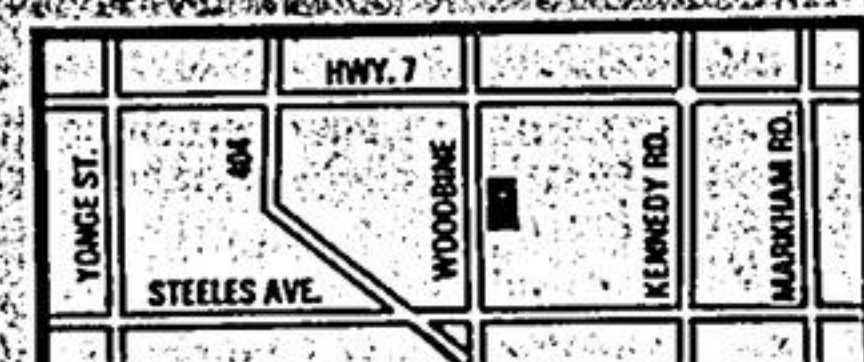
