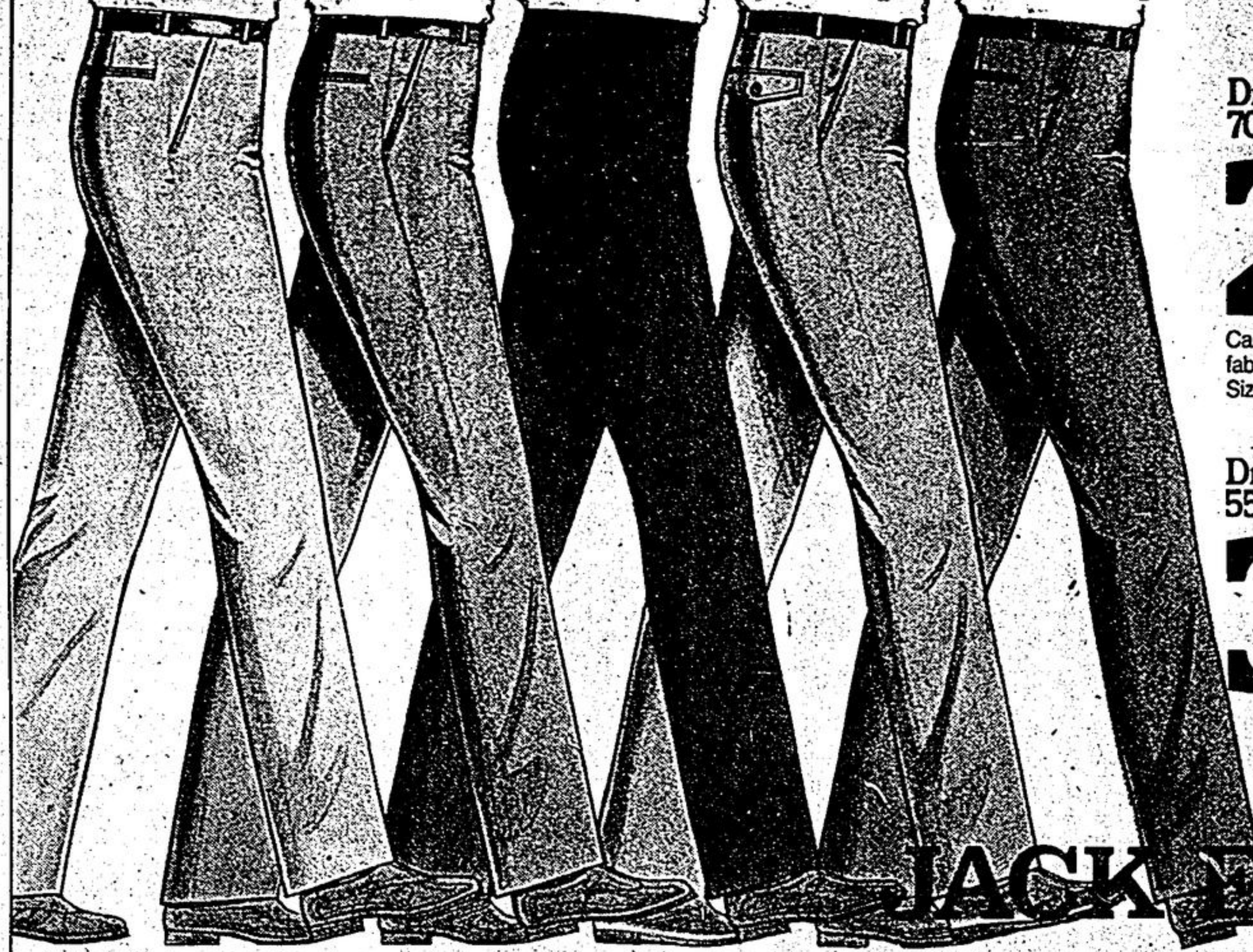

## OPEN LETTER TO CONSTITUENTS

As you know I have become a candidate for the Leadership of the Progressive Conservative Party of Canada, anticipating that after the next election, our Party shall form the government:

A change in government alone however, is not enough unless the change is accompanied by a dedication to cure the ills of the past.

Believing that individual Canadians, rather than government, can best determine how their money should be spent, I have proposed that certain crown corporations subsidies be terminated, foreign development aid to dictatorial regimes be ended and government agencies and departments eliminate programmes which have only illusory benefits for Canadians.

The funds saved would be available to all Canadians through tax reductions under a new simplified Income Tax Act.

The Criminal Code would reflect the wishes of the majority of Canadians in that capital punishment for premeditated murder would be reinstated and the dangerous practice of mandatory release of convicted criminals legislated to an end. Parliament would be requested to fix longer sentences for crimes of violence.

The entire Senior Public Service, appointed by Order-in-Council, would be replaced by Canadians who are committed to the service of the public and not their own interests and those of the Liberal Party.

If you believe that there is merit in my proposals and Canada would benefit from the same I could certainly use your financial support for this expensive undertaking. I should advise you that since such contributions are not made to a political party they are not subject to a federal tax credit.
