

Publisher of Tribune former Oshawa editor

STOUFFVILLE — The Tribune has a new publisher.

Bruce Annan, former editor of Oshawa This Week, was promoted to his new position, April 15, succeeding Barry Wallace, now general manager of the Aurora Banner and Newmarket Era.

Like Mr Wallace, Bruce will shoulder the dual role of publisher at The Tribune's sister newspaper, the Markham Economist and Sun.

The Stouffville-Markham communities are by no means strange territories for Publisher Annan. He was educated in Markham, attending Franklin Street Public School and Markham High. His mother, Audrey Annan, resides in the Dublin Apartments, only a few steps from the Economist and Sun Office.

"It's like coming home," says Bruce. He recalls as a lad, cycling up the Ninth Line to try his luck at fishing from the bridge over the Rouge River. Then, he would continue on to Stouffville for some pizza at Giulio's.

He describes the community as "a great area with a lot of potential".

Publisher Annan's first association with printer's ink occurred when he was hired as a copy boy with the Edmonton Journal. Soon he was promoted to the position of reporter and then to the Sports Department.

His climb up the ladder at Oshawa This Week was rapid—from sports editor, to news editor, to editor in less than six years. At his departure, the editorial staff there included twelve full-time and two part-time people.

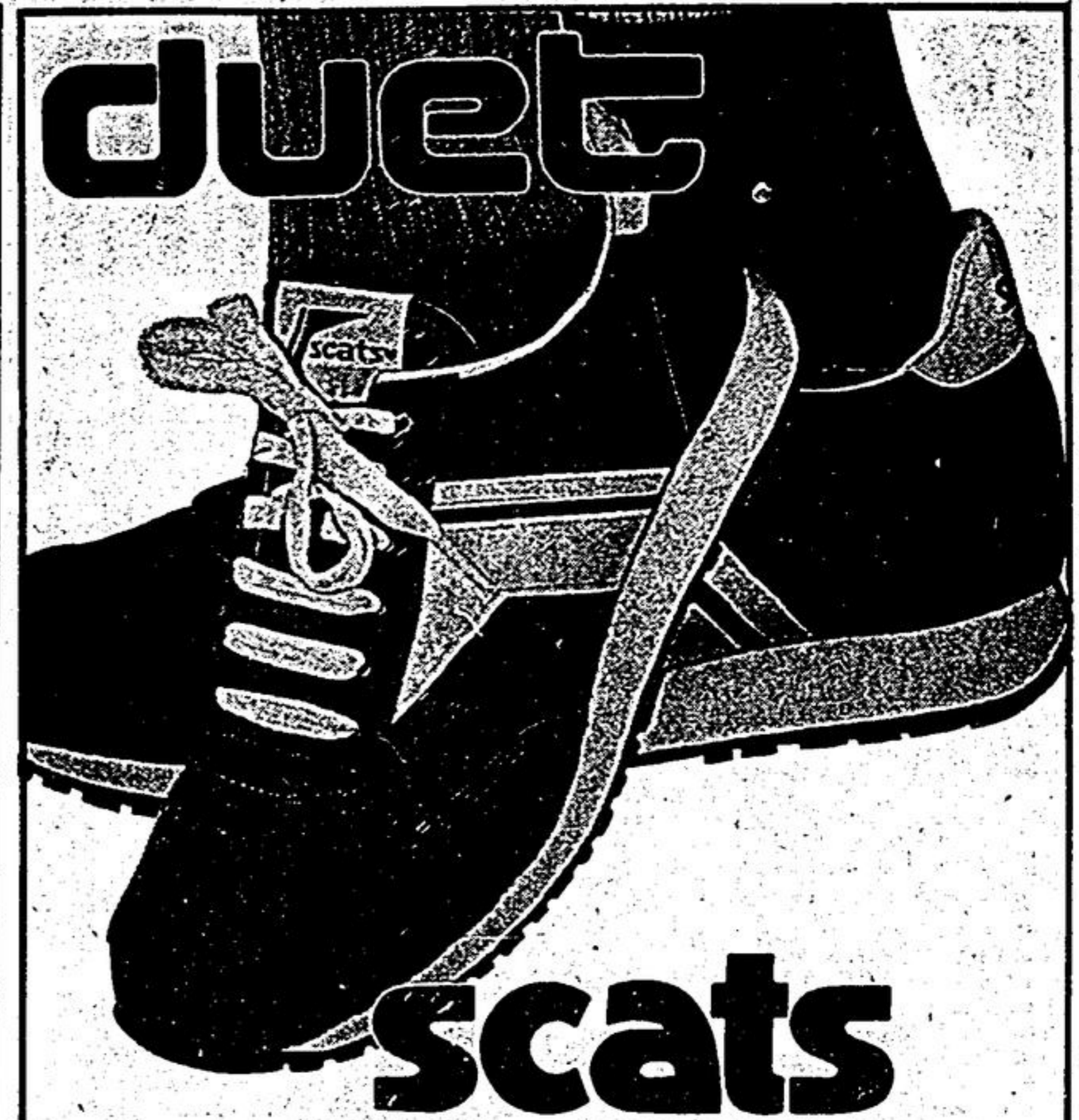
In spite of an extremely busy schedule, Bruce found time to enroll in an accountant's course at Durham College, a training he feels will assist him in his new position. He praised the assistance received from Oshawa This Week's publisher, Tim Whittaker. "He involved me in the operation," he said.

Bruce says he's pleased to be part of a staff that's "deep-rooted in the community". "I'll do all I can to continue that," he concluded.
