Kitchens are colorful but functional

Today's kitchens are not only boasting brighter colors, but they've got surprisingly practical functions built right into their designs.

More and more, the layout and design is a made-to-order package which can accommodate the career-oriented family, whose members also enjoy the occasional home-cooked meal.

Bozena Sandori, the manager of Design Kitchens on 8400 Woodbine Ave., in Markham, says she will consider many factors before ordering the right kitchen.

A designer — whom the majority of people now consult before renovating — records how many people there are in the family, how much time is spent in the kitchen, the type of appliances people use, and the general lifestyles of the family.

Mrs. Sandori's company only does complete renovations. Her staff will tear out the old cupboards and put in new ones.

"But we're pretty flexible," she says. Homeowners can remove their own cabinets, thereby saving some of the costs.

"If they (the clients) are just re-facing, or replacing doors, they don't gain much in actual use, and they're still spending quite a bit of money," adds Mrs. Sandori.

She says that she prefers a customer to come to the showroom first, then get the estimated costs.

Next, the company will visit the house, take measurements and draw up the plans.

Trends in counter surfaces are slightly changing she says — from the traditional woods such as the popular oak — to the brighter, easier-to-clean laminates.


Whether you buy kitchen components of Italian pastel grey with pink or blue trim, the smooth, sometimes shiny surface of the laminate units are more cheerful. Mrs. Sandori says.

"Eating and working areas are often combined," she notes. "Dining rooms are still popular," she adds. "But eating bars, built right into the design are now also popular."

New-fangled sinks are also on the market. Cast iron sinks are often larger than the traditional stainless steel, and like the acrylic sinks, come in a wider variety of colors.


Also, colorful sinks, shaped like hour glasses and small bar sinks are relatively new. "The bar sink acts as a second sink in or near the food preparation area," Mrs. Sandori said.
