Good news

STOUFFVILLE—Mayor King made an announcement recently, that has supporters of the proposed Recreation Centre and the Stouffville Recycling Group equally enthusiastic.

In negotiating a new garbage contract with Ralph Spademan, Mayor King has arranged for materials to be shipped from the recycling depot without charge.

On hearing this, the Recycling Group immediately saw an opportunity to both support the proposed Recreation Centre and encourage recycling in Whitechurch-Stouffville. The Group is establishing a trust fund earmarked for the proposed Centre. One hundred dollars will be contributed to the fund for each load of glass removed from the depot by Mr Spademan plus \$50 for each load of newspaper, cardboard and tin.

"The depot has always operated at a profit by re-selling materials collected. We have used the profits to support community efforts such as Glenbrook Day Camp, Family Life Centre, The Block Parents Association and a softball team. The Group hopes the scheme will increase support for recycling and, in doing so, will also increase the money available for the Centre."

The depot is open every Thursday, 10 a.m. to noon and every Saturday, 9 a.m. to noon. Accepted are bottles (rinsed and without caps); newspapers, tins (cleaned and crushed); and cardboard.

The Recycling Group suggests setting a small area of your garage or basement aside, and accumulating several weeks' supply in cardboard boxes for delivery to the depot located opposite the Town pool.
