- The owner of a privately owned swimming pool is required to obtain a permit for and shall erect AND MAINTAIN an enclosure surrounding the entire swimming pool area to make such body of water not readily accessible to small children.
- You, the pool owner, are responsible for the maintenance of 2. safety standards in the swimming pool area, 365 days a year.
- Swimming pools installed prior to 1975, may not conform to the current Swimming Pool By-law. Please contact the Building and By-Laws Department for an inspection.
- That the owners of all dogs are required to obtain a licence for them:
- That all dogs must be kept under control and on a leash when 5. being walked.
- Pumps, Motors, Condensers and other mechanical equipment 6. relative to Air Conditioning, Heating, Filtering etc., when located in the side yard of your residential property is subject to set back restrictions.
- Prior to installing or constructing a carport, garage, shed, patio deck, fireplace, addition or alterations to your home, you are required to obtain a BUILDING PERMIT.
- Dwellings and additions to, including garages and accessory buildings are subject to minimum set backs from the property lines.
- Residential property line fences are subject to height restrictions.
