

# Ban missile testing

Dear Editor:  
The issue of disarmament is becoming increasingly prominent in the minds of many of us because we perceive the appalling danger inherent in the military policies of the two super powers and their allies.

In Canada our Federal Government seems committed to supporting the Reagan administration in its very aggressive policy of nuclear arms development and deployment and supports the testing of the Cruise Missile in Canada.

Eric Neilson, the acting leader of the Tory party in the House of Commons, is on record as supporting the testing of the Cruise in Canada and supporting Reagan's armaments policy. A Toronto newspaper recently reported that Scott Fennel, our Tory member of parliament for Ontario Riding is also in favour of testing the Cruise Missile in Canada.

The N.D.P. stands alone as the one political party unified in its opposition to the armaments policies of the United States and the Soviet Union in general terms and specifically opposed to the Canadian Government's willingness to allow the testing of the Cruise Missile in Canada.

Let it be clearly understood by all and especially by those who make it a practice to misunderstand, misquote, or misrepresent N.D.P. policies that the N.D.P. is in no way calling for unilateral disarmament on the part of the western alliance.

We of the N.D.P. are demanding that our political leaders return to a less belligerent stance in sincere efforts to gain reductions in nuclear arms with the ultimate aim of eliminating the possibility of the greatest insanity-nuclear warfare and the destruction of us all.

Building bigger and more efficient means to destroy each other is not an intelligent solution to our differences or an assurance of safety. The new wave of protest to nuclear armament is surely our only hope for the future because it may bring world leaders to realize again the necessity

of compromise for survival.

The vast numbers of people involved in "anti-nuclear" demonstrations both in Canada and Europe during the recent Easter weekend encouraged those of us who seek the disarmament option. If demonstrations of these proportions continue and multiply we can only hope that national leaders of both alliances will begin to take the wool out of their ears.

All of us know that it will not be easy to deal with the Russians because they fear us just as much as we fear them but dialogue and negotiations must continue and we in Canada can do our part by refusing to be involved in activity related to nuclear

weapons development or testing.

The N.D.P. in Ontario Riding intends to support any group that shares our concern and we hope to share with individuals or groups of any political persuasion in developing within the Durham Region a movement for nuclear disarmament and peace. This movement must be of sufficient strength that it cannot be ignored any longer by our Federal M.P.

Some work and progress has begun. Much more needs to be done.

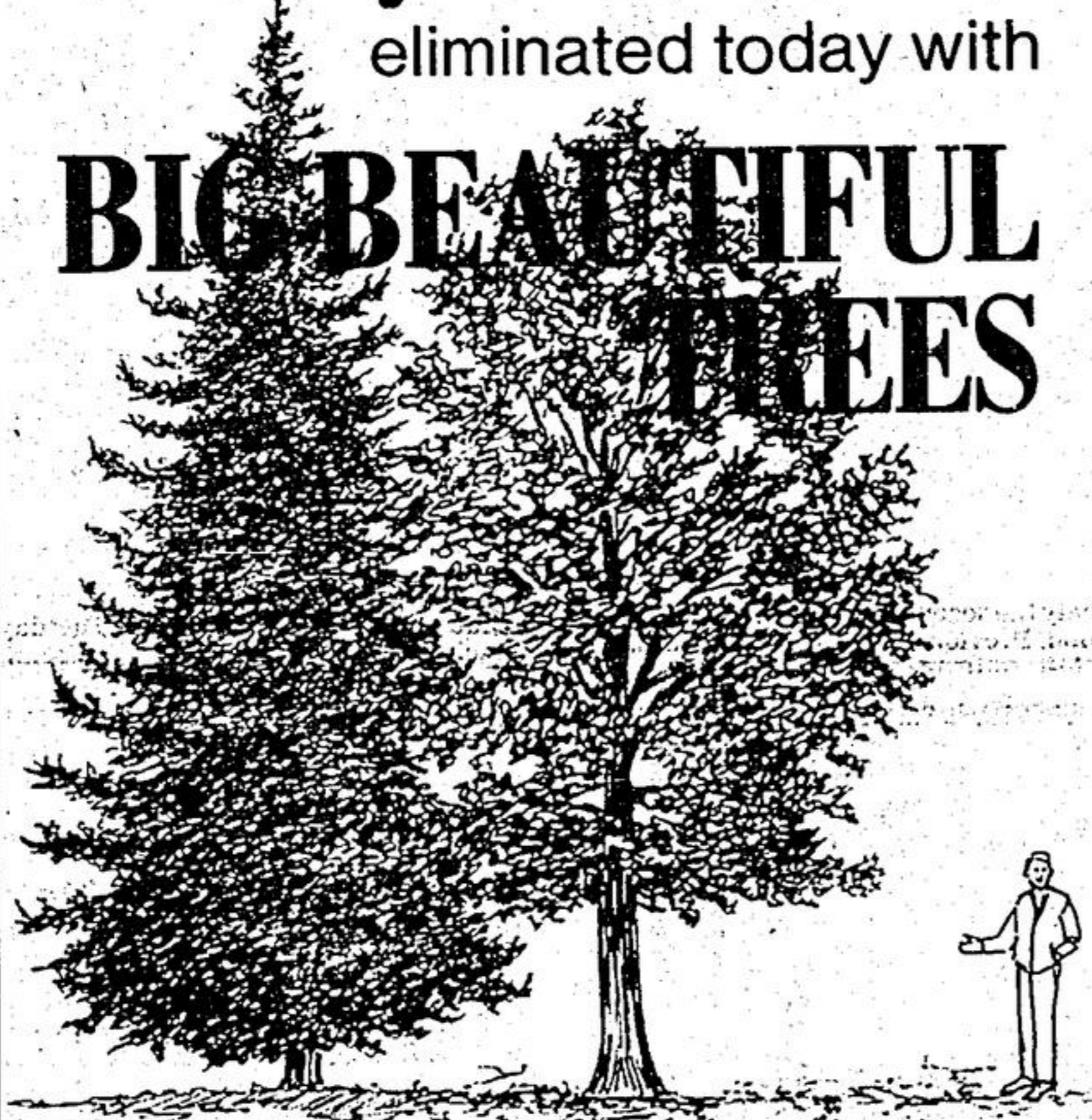
