church community lost a dedicated and faithful friend, July 26, in the sudden passing of Mrs Bertram Taun at St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto. She was 79.

Mrs Taun, the former Alice Wright, was born in Toronto, the daughter of Addison and Mary. Wright. Following her marriage, she and her husband farmed on the Bloomington Road, between Warden and Woodbine Avenue more than 30 years. Mr Taun died in November, 1960.

Following her husband's death, Mrs Taun moved to Main Street, Stouffville, where she soon became associated with the congregation of Stouffville United Church, the U.C.W. and the Women's Institute. A particular denomination, however, proved no barrier. Mrs Taun attended special services and events in all of Stouffville's churches, enjoying the inspiration and friendships that such associations engendered.

She also had a close attachment to the Stouffville Horticultural Society and while she seldom participated in shows, she loved flowers and plants.

Mrs Taun was herself an accommodating person who made friends wherever she went. Rev. Cecil Tiller, her pastor, made mention of this at the service, Thursday, in the O'Neill Chapel, Stouffville. Pall-bearers were-three grandsons, Bob Walls, Brian Walls and Murray Pattenden; and three sons-in-law, Richard Frisby, Bill Walls and Elwood Pattenden. Interment was at Heise Hill Cemetery.


