

Police Report Office searched

STOUFFVILLE — Two men, arrested near Alliston, have been charged with a breaking into Neil Patrick Motors Ltd., early Saturday morning, causing extensive damage and stealing an automobile.

The pair are also charged with breaking into Ferguson Chevrolet-Oldsmobile Ltd., at Sutton and taking a vehicle.

According to York Regional Police, the suspects, both from Toronto, gained entry to the Patrick building around 1 a.m., July 23. Once inside, they ransacked an office and forced open a safe. They made off with tools and a quantity of cash. From Stouffville, they drove to Sutton where they stole another vehicle, leaving the Patrick car behind.

They were apprehended a short time later.

The accused, Gilbert John Wildfong, 20, and Sunset MacDonald, 30, both of Toronto, appeared in Provincial Court, Newmarket, Monday. They are charged with three counts of theft over \$200; two counts of break, enter and theft; possession of safe-breaking instruments and mischief to private property.

Harry Barber touched all facets of rural life

STOUFFVILLE — Rev. Gardiner Ward, associate pastor of Trinity United Church, Uxbridge, conducted the service, Aug. 10 from the O'Neill Funeral Chapel, Stouffville, for Harry H. Barber following his passing, Aug. 1 at Uxbridge Cottage Hospital. He was 81.

Born in Toronto, one of nine in the family of Timothy and Eleanor Barber, he commenced farming in the Wexford area at age 16. Following the sale of that property, he moved to Victoria Square in 1926 where he became involved in every facet of community life.

Harry Barber served on Markham

Twp. Council; was a charter member of the Victoria Square and District Lions Club; was an executive member on the Richmond Hill Fair Board and a director with the Ontario Jersey Cattle Breeders' Association.

He was active in the work of Victoria Square United Church, serving as an elder and steward in the congregation. Following his departure from the community, he remained an honorary elder in the church, an appointment he appreciated.

Mr and Mrs Barber, (the former Evelyn Gooderham), celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary in Nov. 1976.

Harry Barber loved sports including hockey, baseball and soccer. He was an excellent skater and, as a young man, was scouted by the Toronto Maple Leafs. He also enjoyed music. His favorite instrument was the violin.

It was five years ago that he was stricken with cancer. Despite the seriousness of his illness, he refused to give up the fight. For a time, he resided with his sister Eva in Port Credit and then with his daughter, Marjorie at Uxbridge.

Harry Barber maintained a close association with his family and was extremely proud of each—daughters

Evelyn Matthews of Breckin; Betty Jeffries; Rockwood; Kathleen Brown, Richmond Hill; Marjorie Davie, Uxbridge; sons Harry of Ferguson and David of Claremont; 21 grandchildren and one great-grandchild. He has two sisters, Eva Conover, Port Credit and Dorothy Barber, Toronto.

The O'Neill Chapel was filled for the service, Wednesday, with interment, Victoria Square Cemetery. The pallbearers were nine grandsons—Jim and Roy Jeffries, Neil, Paul and Scott Brown, George and Michael Davie, Tim and Kyle Barber.
