LETTER FROM PRISON

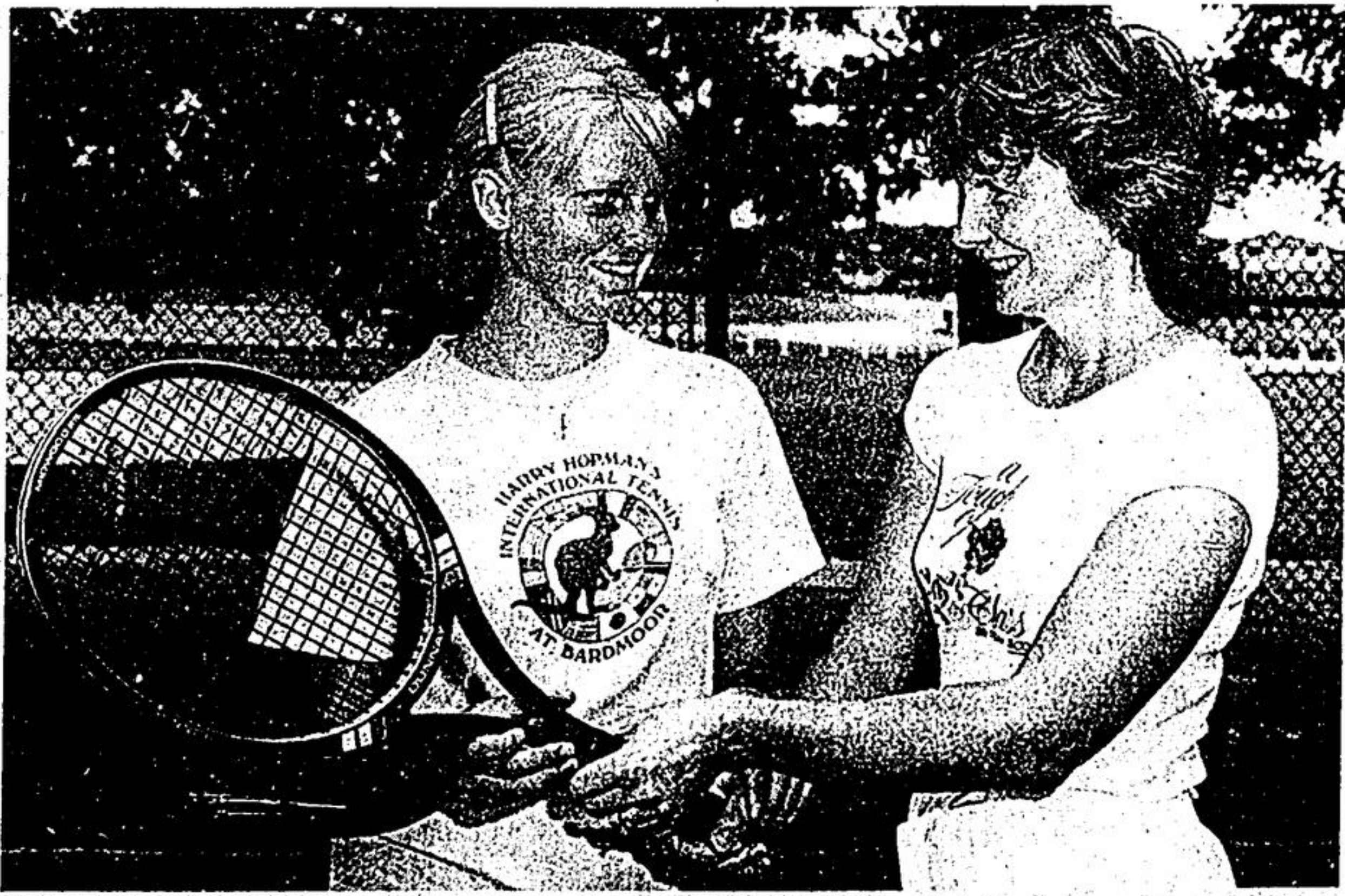
