Surviving are three sons, James, William and Robert; three daughters, Norma Carey, Grand Bend; Doreen Deacon, R.R. 4, Stouffville; Elaine Pagnello, Scarborough; 19 grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren. A brother, William Gould lives at Mount Forest.
