

Soccer club celebrates successful year

The Whitchurch-Stouffville Soccer Club held its first annual dinner and awards night at Latcham Hall on Tuesday evening. Highlight of the evening was the presentation of awards and trophies to the Castle Royals team and their coach Martin Johannessen

and coach Alfons Rubbens and his Panthers; both teams won their respective divisions this year.
