 Service projects last year included donations towards video equipment for the library; to the Markham Stouffville Hospital Building Fund and the purchase of Christmas hampers for needy families.

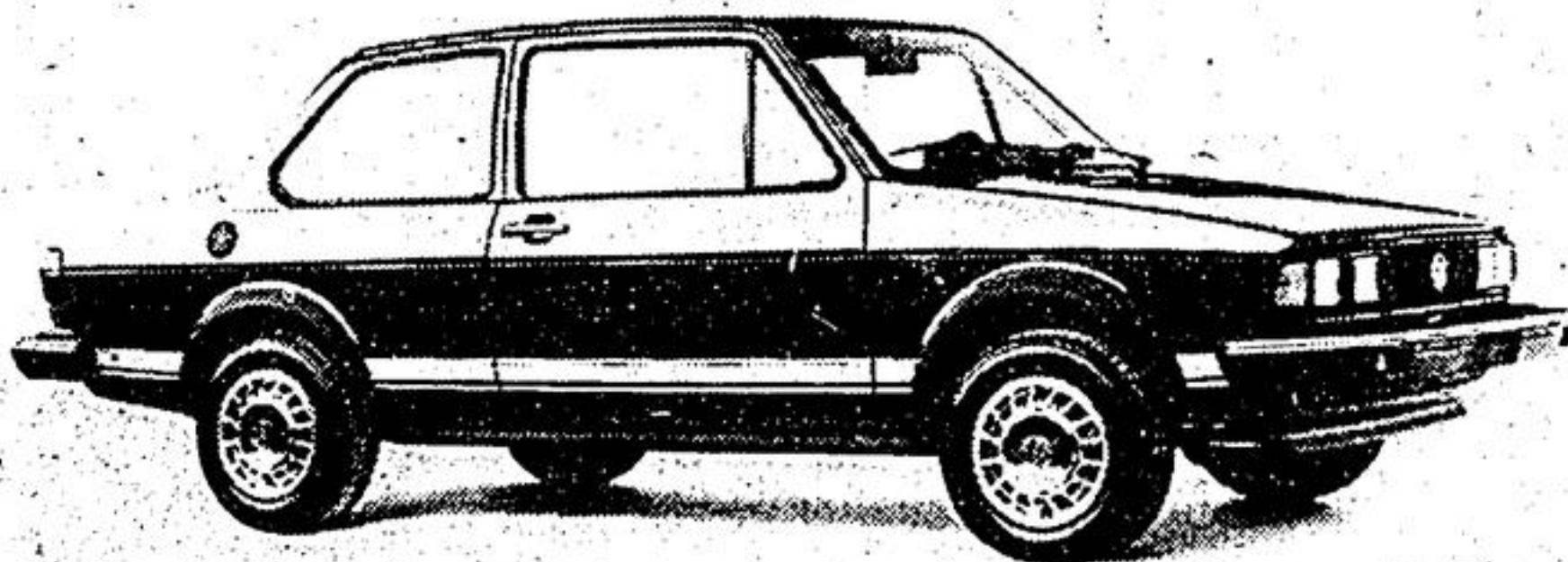
Editor's Mail

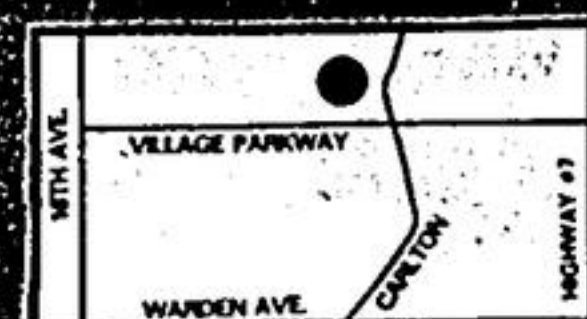
