authentic as we could possibly manage, except for the whiskey. According to an item in the diary of Mrs. John Graves Simcoe, the drink most preferred by the early settlers at barn raising bees was whiskey. Evidently, they drank 'home brew' all during the hot and heavy job.

There was certainly no way that the museum would serve whiskey, but there was a lot of coffee consumed. If, at any time, a volunteer wanted a drink of beer, he had to buy it from the Ballantrae Lions Club over in the next field. The barn went up quickly as most of the men were needed at home for

chores, and by dark, one man was on the roof hammering rafter supports. The Stouffville Concert Band, the volunteers (both local and from as far away as Dundalk), the women who prepared and served the noon meal, the Women's Institutes, who supplied pies and the folks who just came to encour-
