## New life for ex-racer

One does not generally equate horse racing with the world of show jumping. However, the two sometimes come together through a strange force of circumstance that can have a happy ending for both animal and owners.

George and Sue McKenzie of White Oaks Farm have recently managed to get an ex-race horse, Darn Near Perfect, Hunter approved.

The twelve-year-old thoroughbred stallion had a promising racing career cut short when he shattered his knee while leading a race

at Aqueduct; he had previously won four races and placed in many others.

After an eight month restup in Florida, owner Donald Home shipped a less than perfect 'Darn Near Perfect' back to Cedar Grove Farm to stand at stud; with excellent results. He has sired many promising youngsters, all proven winners in the ring and at the race track.

Two years ago Bill Down of Queens Gait purchased him and he continued to sire excellent stock. This April, he was bought by the McKenzies, whose main objective was

to get him Hunter approved so as to strengthen their existing stable. They received approval on Oct. 1 and already have a four-month-old filly out of a hunter mare.

While most race horses end their careers in the knackers yard, particularly when injured, in this case the story has a happy ending. Darn Near Perfect has settled in well at White Oaks, he has a perfect disposition and is easy to handle; a real show-off despite his shattered knee, and the young student-riders love him.

He will never race again, and he most

certainly won't be jumping any fences. He is, however,

doing something even better. Producing fine horses

that future young riders can try their skills on.

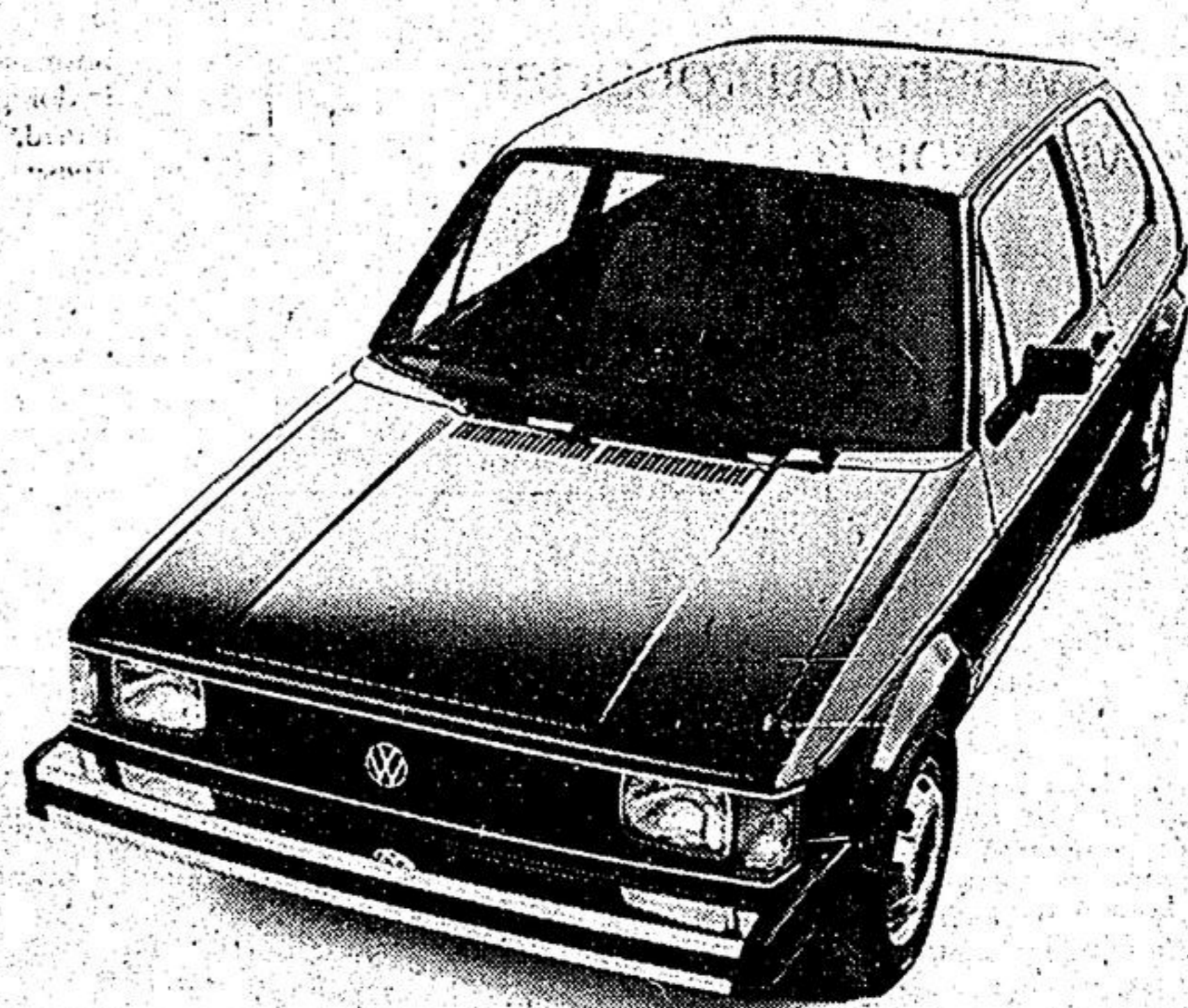
